AN ORDINANCE to provide that George Livingston Callender shall be deemed to have been accepted as a contributor under the Widows' and Orphans' Pensions Ordinance.

Commencement.

ENACTED by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof. Enactment

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Widows' and Orphans' Pensions (George Livingston Callender) Ordinance, 1960. Short title

Interpretation.

2. In this Ordinance—

“the Committee” means the Public Service Widows and Orphans Pensions Committee established by section 4 of the Ordinance;

Ch. 9. No. 8.

“the Ordinance” means the Widows' and Orphans' Pensions Ordinance;

“the Territory” means the Colony of Trinidad and Tobago.

George Livingston Callender deemed to have been accepted as a contributor under the Widows' and Orphans' Pensions Ordinance, Ch. 9. No. 8.

3. Notwithstanding any provision contained in the Ordinance, George Livingston Callender, deceased, former Foreman in the Department of Works of the Territory, shall be deemed to have been entitled to the privileges and benefits of a contributor under the Ordinance with effect from the 1st day of January, 1957, as if in accordance with the provisions of section 22 of the Ordinance he had undergone a medical examination to the satisfaction of the Committee and had been accepted by the Committee as a contributor.

No refund of contribution to be made.

4. No refund shall be made of any abatement from the salary of the said George Livingston Callender retained by the Accountant General as a contribution under the Ordinance pending his acceptance by this Committee as a contributor.
