AN ORDINANCE to prescribe, in accordance with the provisions of the Trinidad and Tobago (Constitution) Orders in Council, 1950 to 1959, the salaries and allowances to be paid to the holders of certain offices, the offices that are to be subject to the control of the Judicial and Legal Service Commission and the offices that are to constitute the personal staff of the Governor.

[On Proclamation]

ENACTED by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof.

1. (1) This Ordinance may be cited as the Constitution (Prescribed Matters) Ordinance, 1960.

(2) This Ordinance shall come into operation on a day to be appointed by the Governor by proclamation published in the *Royal Gazette*.

Interpretation.

2. In this Ordinance—

“Chief Justice” and “Acting Chief Justice” mean respectively the Chief Justice and the Acting Chief Justice of the Supreme Court;

“Order in Council” means the Trinidad and Tobago (Constitution) Orders in Council, 1950 to 1959;

“Puisne Judge” and “Temporary Puisne Judge” mean respectively a Puisne Judge of the Supreme Court and a person temporarily appointed a Judge of the Supreme Court;

“Speaker” and Deputy Speaker” mean respectively the Speaker and the Deputy Speaker of the Legislative Council.

Salaries and allowances of holders of certain offices.

3. (1) There shall be paid to the holders of the respective offices set forth in the first column of the First Schedule to this Ordinance salary at the rate specified in the second column of the said Schedule in respect of such office.

(2) There shall be paid to the holder of any office specified in the first column of the First Schedule to this Ordinance such allowances as may be prescribed by order of the Governor in Council and approved by resolution of the Legislative Council.

Offices subject to Judicial and Legal Service Commission.

4. Section 66A of the Order in Council shall apply to the offices in the public service specified in the Second Schedule to this Ordinance.

Personal Staff of the Governor.

5. The offices specified in the Third Schedule to this Ordinance shall be deemed to constitute the personal staff of the Governor for the purposes of section 65E of the Order in Council.

6. The Executive Council and Legislative Council (Emoluments) Ordinance, 1956, is hereby repealed.
