AN ORDINANCE to amend the Legislative Council
(Elections) Ordinance, Ch. 2. No. 2.

[23rd June, 1955.]

Commencement

ENACTED by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the Enactment
advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Legislative Council Short title
(Elections) (Amendment) Ordinance, 1955, and shall be read
as one with the Legislative Council (Elections) Ordinance, Ch 2. No. 2
hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

2. Subsection (2) of section 44A of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by inserting immediately after the word "Force" appearing in the second line thereof the words "or in the Special Reserve Police established under the Special Reserve Police Ordinance".

3. Section 55 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by adding at the end thereof the following new subsection to be numbered (4):—

"(4) In subsection (1) of this section, the expression "polling day", in relation to any elector whose name appears on a Police voters list, shall be construed as meaning the date on which such elector may record his vote in accordance with the provisions of the Fifth Schedule hereto."

4. The Fifth Schedule to the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended—

- (a) in rule 6 thereof by substituting for the word "three" appearing in the first line, the word "four";
- (b) by substituting for rule 10 thereof the following:—

"10. The Supervisor of Elections shall cause to be delivered to the returning officer for each electoral district the parcel referred to in rule 9 of this Schedule relating to such electoral district. Such delivery shall be effected on polling day in the case of every electoral district except that of Tobago, and in the case of Tobago on the day before polling day and if that be not practicable, then, on polling day."

Passed in Council this third day of June, in the year of Our Lord one thousand nine hundred and fifty-five.
