AN ORDINANCE to amend the Deportation (British Subjects)  
Ordinance, Ch. 20. No. 3.

[16th February, 1956.]

ENACTED by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the  
advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof. Enactment.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Deportation (British Short title.  
Subjects) (Amendment) Ordinance, 1956, and shall be read as  
one with the Deportation (British Subjects) Ordinance, in this Ch. 20. No. 3  
Ordinance referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

Section 2 of

2. Section 2 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended—  
(a) by inserting at the end of subsection (1) thereof the following new definition:—

“trust territory” means a territory administered by the Government of any part of Her Majesty’s dominions under the trusteeship system of the United Nations.”;

- (b) by inserting immediately after subsection (1) thereof the following new subsection to be numbered (1A):—

“(1A) This Ordinance shall have effect in relation to citizens of the Republic of Ireland who are not British subjects in like manner as it has effect in relation to British subjects.”;

- (c) by substituting for paragraph (c) of subsection (2) thereof the following:—

“(c) has been ordinarily resident in the Colony continuously for a period of seven years or more and since the completion of such period of residence has not been ordinarily resident continuously for a period of seven years or more in any other part of Her Majesty’s dominions or in India or in the Republic of Ireland or in any territory under Her Majesty’s protection or in any trust territory or in South West Africa; or”;

- (d) by inserting in paragraph (d) of subsection (2) thereof immediately after the figure “1914” the words and figure “or the British Nationality Act, 1948”; and

- (e) by inserting immediately before the word “resident” in line 6 of subsection (3) thereof the word “ordinarily”.

Passed in Council this twenty-seventh day of January, in the year of Our Lord one thousand nine hundred and fifty-six.
