AN ORDINANCE for the Incorporation of certain persons as Trustees of the Holy Utopian Spiritual Temple of Trinidad.

WHEREAS there has been established in the Colony a Religious Association known as the Holy Utopian Spiritual Temple of Trinidad (hereinafter called "the Temple") which is representative of the Christ Institution Incorporated of the United States of America in the Colony:

AND WHEREAS William Evans Earl, Carlton Esmond Goddard and Aubrey Gittens all of the Town of San Fernando in the Island of Trinidad have been appointed Trustees of the Temple:

AND WHEREAS it is expedient that the said Trustees for the time being of the Temple should be incorporated and should have power to hold lands and other property in trust for the Temple:

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Holy Utopian Spiritual Temple of Trinidad (Incorporation) Ordinance. Short title.

2. The said William Evans Earl, Carlton Esmond Goddard and Aubrey Gittens and their successors in office as such Trustees as aforesaid shall be and are hereby created a body corporate by the name of "The Incorporated Trustees of the Holy Utopian Spiritual Temple of Trinidad" (hereinafter called "the Incorporated Trustees") and by that name shall have perpetual succession and shall and may sue and be sued in all Courts of Justice in the Colony and shall have and use a common seal which may from time to time be changed by the Temple. Incorporation of Trustees

3. The Incorporated Trustees shall, subject to the rules, regulations and control of the Temple have full power to acquire for the Temple by purchase, exchange, demise, gift, bequest or otherwise, lands in perpetuity or for a life or lives or for any term of years and also any money, securities for money, goods or chattels whatsoever, and, subject to such rules and regulations and control as aforesaid, to take, hold and enjoy the same and subject also to the performance of any trust upon which the said lands or other property money securities for money, goods or chattels may have been acquired. Trustees may acquire properties.

4. It shall be lawful for the Incorporated Trustees subject to such rules, regulations and control as aforesaid from time to time by deed under their seal to sell, demise, grant, convey, exchange or otherwise dispose of any lands or other property vested or which may hereafter be vested in them. Trustees may dispose of property.

Saving rights
of Crown.

5. Nothing in this Ordinance shall affect or be deemed to affect the rights of Her Majesty, Her Heirs or Successors or of any bodies politic or corporate or of any other persons except such as are mentioned or referred to in this Ordinance and those claiming by, through, from or under them.
