AN ORDINANCE to amend the Legislative Council

ENACTED by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the
advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof.

Enactment.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Legislative Council
(Elections) (Amendment No. 2) Ordinance, 1956, and shall be
read as one with the Legislative Council (Elections) Ordinance,
hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

2. Section 3 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended—

(a) in subsection (1), by substituting the word “twenty-four” for the word “eighteen”; and

(b) by inserting as subsections (3) and (4) thereof the following subsections:—

“(3) References to the City of Port-of-Spain and to the Borough of San Fernando shall be construed as references to the said City and Borough as at the 1st day of May, 1956, described respectively in the First Schedule to the Port-of-Spain Corporation Ordinance and in the First Schedule to the San Fernando Corporation Ordinance.

(4) Each electoral district shall be represented on the Legislative Council by one elected member.”

3. Section 6 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended—

(a) by substituting for subsections (1) and (2) thereof the following subsections:—

“(1) The Governor may from time to time, on the recommendation of the Supervisor of Elections, appoint for each electoral district a registration officer who shall receive such remuneration as may be prescribed.

(2) The Supervisor of Elections may appoint fit and proper persons to assist a registration officer in the performance of his duties under this Ordinance and every such assistant shall receive such remuneration as may be prescribed.”; and

(b) in subsection (3), by inserting immediately after the words “other than” the words “a supervisor of enumerators or”.

4. Section 15 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by inserting after subsection (3) thereof the following subsection:—

“(4) If any poll clerk dies or becomes incapable of performing his duties during the taking of the poll, the presiding officer shall forthwith appoint some other person to act as poll clerk.”

6. Section 20 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by inserting after subsection (5) thereof the following subsection:—

"(6) No person shall at any election be nominated as a candidate for more than one electoral district. Where at any election nomination papers are received nominating the same person as a candidate for more than one electoral district and such papers would, but for the provisions of this section, be valid, every such nomination shall be deemed to be void and the deposit accompanying every such nomination shall forthwith be credited to general revenue."

7. Subsection (2) of section 23 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by deleting the words "Port-of-Spain East or San Fernando" and substituting therefor the words "Port-of-Spain North-East, Port-of-Spain South-East, San Fernando West or San Fernando East".

THIRD SCHEDULE

PORT-OF-SPAIN NORTH

ALL such parts of the City of Port-of-Spain as are bounded on the:—

NORTH: By a line commencing from a point on the northern boundary of the City where it coincides with Brunton Street continuing in a generally easterly direction along the said boundary to a point where it is intersected by the production of the centre line of Norfolk Street.

EAST : Continuing southwards along the production of the said line to and along the centre line of Norfolk Street to and along the centre line of Belmont Circular Road in a generally southerly direction to its intersection with the St. Ann's or Dry River; thence still continuing southwards along the centre line of the said river to its junction with Park Street.

SOUTH : Continuing westwards along the centre line of Park Street to and along the centre line of Tragarete Road; thence in a north-westerly direction to the City boundary and continuing in the same direction along the said boundary to and along the centre line of the Western Main Road to its junction with George Cabral Street.

WEST : Thence in a northerly direction along the centre line of George Cabral Street as far as Quamina Street, thence eastwards along the centre line of Quamina Street to Jerry Street thence northwards along the centre line of Jerry Street to Angelina Street continuing eastwards along the centre line of Angelina Street to Bourne Road; thence northwards along the centre line of Bourne Road to Patna Street, thence eastwards along the centre line of Patna Street to Brunton Street; thence northwards along the centre line of Brunton Street to the point of commencement.

All of which boundaries are delineated and shown bordered pink on a plan numbered X.F.40 dated the 18th day of May, 1956, signed by the Director of Surveys and deposited in his office at Government Buildings in Port-of-Spain.

PORT-OF-SPAIN NORTH-EAST

ALL such parts of the City of Port-of-Spain as are bounded on the :—

NORTH : By the northern boundary of the City from a point where it is intersected by the production of the centre line of Norfolk Street to the north-eastern extremity of the said boundary.

EAST : Thence continuing southwards along the said eastern boundary of the City as far as Laventille Road.

SOUTH : Thence in a westerly direction along the northern boundary of the electoral district of Port-of-Spain South-East to the point where the said boundary intersects the St. Ann's or Dry River.

WEST : Thence continuing in a generally northerly direction along the centre line of the said River to where it crosses Belmont Circular Road; thence proceeding in an easterly and northerly direction along the centre line of Belmont Circular Road into and along the centre line of Norfolk Street, continuing northwards to the point of commencement.

All of which boundaries are delineated and shown bordered pink on a plan numbered X.F.40 dated the 18th day of May, 1956, signed by the Director of Surveys and deposited in his office at Government Buildings in Port-of-Spain.

PORT-OF-SPAIN SOUTH

ALL such parts of the City of Port-of-Spain as are bounded on the :—

NORTH : By the northern boundary of the City from its western extremity continuing in an easterly direction to the point where the said boundary is intersected by the centre line of Brunton Street.

EAST : Continuing southwards along the centre line of Brunton Street to Patna Street, thence westwards along the centre line of Patna Street to Bournes Road; thence southwards along the centre line of Bournes Road to Angelina Street; thence westwards along the centre line of Angelina Street to Jerry Street; thence southwards along the centre line of Jerry Street to and along the centre line of the latter to Quamina Street and westwards along the centre line of Quamina Street to George Cabral Street; thence southwards along the centre line of George Cabral Street to the Western Main Road; thence in an easterly direction along the centre line of the Western Main Road into and along the centre line of Tragarete Road as far as Richmond Street; thence southwards along the centre line of Richmond Street to Duke Street and continuing westwards along the centre line of Duke Street to Melbourne Street; thence southwards along the centre line of Melbourne Street to Sydney Street; thence westwards along the centre line of Sydney Street to Shine Street; thence northwards along the centre line of Shine Street to Duke Street; thence westwards along the centre line of Duke Street to Scott Bushe Street; thence along the centre line of Scott Bushe Street in a northerly direction to Ariapita Avenue; thence along the centre line of Ariapita Avenue in a westerly direction to Colville Street; thence southwards along the centre line of Colville Street to Wrightson Road; thence in a south-easterly direction along the centre line of Wrightson Road to and along the centre line of Charles Street to Richmond Street; thence southwards along the centre line of Richmond Street and along the production of this line to the sea coast.

SOUTH : Thence continuing along the sea coast in a generally westerly
AND direction to a point where it meets the western boundary of the
WEST City; thence in a northerly direction along this boundary to the
point of commencement.

All of which boundaries are delineated and shown bordered pink on a plan numbered X.F.40 dated the 18th day of May, 1956, signed by the Director of Surveys and deposited in his office at Government Buildings in Port-of-Spain.

PORT-OF-SPAIN SOUTH-EAST

ALL such parts of the City of Port-of-Spain as are bounded on the :—

NORTH : By a line commencing from the point of intersection of Colville Street and Ariapita Avenue in a generally easterly direction along the centre line of Ariapita Avenue to Scott Bushe Street; thence along the centre line of Scott Bushe Street in a southerly direction to Duke Street; thence in an easterly direction along the

centre line of Duke Street to Shine Street; thence southwards along the centre line of Shine Street to Sydney Street; thence eastwards along the centre line of Sydney Street to Melbourne Street; thence northwards along the centre line of Melbourne Street to Duke Street; thence eastwards along the centre line of Duke Street to Richmond Street; thence northwards along the centre line of Richmond Street to Tragarete Road; thence in a south-easterly direction along the centre line of Tragarete Road to Park Street; thence eastwards along the centre line of Park Street to its intersection with the St. Ann's or Dry River; thence in a generally south-easterly direction along the centre line of the said river to a point where it crosses Duke Street; thence in a north-easterly direction along the centre line of Duke Street to its intersection with Belgrade Street; thence northwards along the centre line of Belgrade Street to its junction with Fromager Street; thence in a south-easterly direction along the centre line of Fromager Street to its junction with La Resource Street; thence southwards along the centre line of La Resource Street to and along the centre line of an alley passing between Nos. 10 and 14 La Resource Street to Laventille Road; thence in an easterly direction along the centre line of Laventille Road to its junction with the City boundary.

EAST : Continuing southwards along the said boundary to the sea coast.

SOUTH: Thence in a generally westerly direction along the sea coast to a point where the production of the centre line of Richmond Street meets the sea coast.

WEST : Thence northwards along the production of the said centre line to and along the centre line of Richmond Street as far as Charles Street; thence westwards along the centre line of Charles Street into and along the centre line of Wrightson Road to Colville Street; thence in a north-easterly direction along the centre line of Colville Street to the point of commencement.

All of which boundaries are delineated and shown bordered pink on a plan numbered X.F.40 dated the 18th day of May, 1956, signed by the Director of Surveys and deposited in his office at Government Buildings in Port-of-Spain.

ST. GEORGE WEST

ALL such parts of the County of St. George as are bounded on the :—

NORTH : By a line commencing at a point on the northern sea coast which point is the north-eastern corner of the area leased by His Late Majesty to the United States of America, hereinafter referred to as the Leased Area, and continuing along the sea coast in an easterly direction to the eastern boundary of the Ward of Diego Martin.

EAST: Thence in a southerly direction along the eastern boundary of the Ward of Diego Martin to and along the centre line of the Saddle Road to the northern boundary of the City of Port-of-Spain.

SOUTH : Thence in a westerly direction along the Northern boundary of the City of Port-of-Spain to the sea coast and continuing along the coast in a westerly direction to Point Sinet at the south-eastern corner of the Leased Area.

WEST : Thence in a northerly direction along the eastern boundary of the Leased Area to the sea coast at the point of commencement.

All of which boundaries are delineated and shown bordered pink on a plan numbered X.F.48 dated the 18th day of May, 1956, signed by the Director of Surveys and deposited in his office at Government Buildings in Port-of-Spain.

And also the Islands of the Bocas, the Islands of Gaspar Grande, Gasparillo, Carrera and Cronstadt and the Five Islands.

LAVENTILLE

ALL such parts of the County of St. George as are bounded on the :—

NORTH : By a line commencing at a point on the northern boundary of the City of Port-of-Spain from Hengloe Lane and continuing northwards to the south-western corner of lands of Emily Tardy now N. Donahye and continuing in an easterly direction along a ridge of hills to Mon Repos Road; thence along the centre line of Mon Repos Road to the eastern boundary of lands of Camps-Campains.

EAST : Thence southwards along the centre line of Mon Repos Road to a point where the prolongation westward of the northern boundary of Grand Bras Estate meets it; thence eastwards along this prolongation to the north-western corner of Grand Bras Estate; thence southwards along the western boundary of Grand Bras Estate to a ridge of hills and continuing along the ridge of hills in an easterly direction to the north-western corner of the lands of R. Azor; thence southwards along the western boundaries of the said lands and lands of Scholastique Diaz, Sookie and Radhiah to the Malick Crown Trace; thence along the centre line of the said trace to First Street and eastwards along the centre line of First Street to and along the centre line of Fourth Avenue to the Eastern Main Road; thence in a westerly direction along the centre line of the Eastern Main Road to Seventh Avenue; thence southwards along the centre line of Seventh Avenue to the Trinidad Government Railway Reserve; thence in a westerly direction to Eighth Avenue; thence along the centre line of Eighth Avenue and continuing southwards to the centre line of the Churchill-Roosevelt Highway; thence in an easterly direction along the centre line of the said Highway to the point opposite the eastern boundary of Barataria Estate; thence continuing in a southerly direction along the eastern boundary of Barataria Estate to the centre line of the Caroni River.

SOUTH : Thence in a westerly direction along the centre line of Caroni River to the sea coast.

WEST : Thence in a general northerly direction along the sea coast to the eastern boundary to the City of Port-of-Spain; thence continuing northwards along the eastern boundary of the said City to and along the northern boundary of the said City to the point of commencement.

All of which boundaries are delineated and shown bordered pink on a plan numbered X.F.48 dated the 18th day of May, 1956, signed by the Director of Surveys and deposited in his office at Government Buildings in Port-of-Spain.

SAN JUAN

ALL such parts of the County of St. George as are bounded on the :—

NORTH : By a line commencing from a point where the western boundary of the Ward of St. Ann's meets the sea coast (i.e. the eastern boundary of the electoral district of St. George West) and continuing along the sea coast to the eastern boundary of the Ward of St. Ann's.

EAST : Thence in a southerly direction along the eastern boundary of the Ward of St. Ann's to and along the western boundary and portion of the southern boundary of lands of Madame Bime to the north-eastern corner of Mount Hope Estate; thence in a southerly direction along the said Estate to and along the centre line of the Mount D'Or Crown Trace continuing along the centre line of Champs Fleurs Halt Road to the Trinidad Government Railway Reserve; thence along the eastern boundary of Mount Lambert.

SOUTH : From the point where Mount Lambert Old Road meets the eastern boundary of Mount Lambert westwards along the centre line of the said road to the San Juan River; thence in a more or less northerly direction along the centre line of the said river to and along a drain (commonly called the Maitagua River) to the Eastern Main Road; thence in a westerly direction along the centre line of the Eastern Main Road to Ryan Street; thence northwards along the centre line of Ryan Street to St. Joseph Street; thence along the centre line of St. Joseph Street to Queen Street; thence along the centre line of Queen Street to and along the centre line of Real Street to and along the centre line of Hislop Street to Graham Trace; thence along the centre line of Graham Trace to and along the centre line of Quarry Road to the Santa Cruz Old Road and continuing in a westerly direction to the San Juan River; thence in a northerly direction along the centre line of the said River to its intersection with the Saddle Road; thence southwards along the centre line of Saddle Road to the Eastern Main Road; thence westwards along the centre line of the Eastern Main Road to Don Miguel Road; thence along the centre line of Don Miguel Road to the unnamed Street along the northern boundary of the lands now or formerly of the heirs of Jacob Lewis and continuing in a westerly direction to the eastern boundary of the electoral district of Laventille.

WEST : Thence in a northerly direction along the eastern and northern boundaries of the electoral district of Laventille to the northern boundary of the City of Port-of-Spain and continuing westwards along the said boundary to the Saddle Road; thence northwards along the eastern boundary of the electoral district of St. George West to the sea coast at the point of commencement.

All of which boundaries are delineated and shown bordered pink on a plan numbered X.F.48 dated the 18th day of May, 1956, signed by the Director of Surveys and deposited in his office at Government Buildings in Port-of-Spain.

ST. JOSEPH

ALL such parts of the County of St. George as are bounded on the:—

NORTH : By a line commencing at a point on the northern sea coast at the eastern boundary of the Ward of St. Ann's (i.e., the eastern boundary of the electoral district of San Juan) and continuing along the sea coast in an easterly direction approximately midway between Chupara Point and Abercromby Point, the East Co-ordinate of which is 406,000 links.

EAST : Thence due South along an imaginary line of Co-ordinate East 406,000 links to the boundary of the Ward of Tacarigua; thence in a south-westerly direction along the said Ward boundary to the Acono Road; thence along the centre line of Acono Road through the lands of J. B. Todd, and continuing in a southerly direction along the centre line of Acono Road to its junction with the Maracas Road; thence along the centre line of the Maracas Road to its intersection with the St. Joseph River; thence along the centre line of the said river to the Eastern Main Road; thence in an easterly direction along the centre line of the Eastern Main Road to its intersection with the Southern Main Road; thence along the centre line of the Southern Main Road to the Caroni River.

SOUTH : Thence in a westerly direction along the centre line of the Caroni River to the eastern boundary of the electoral district of Laventille.

WEST : Thence in a northerly direction along the eastern boundary of the electoral district of Laventille; thence along the southern and eastern boundaries of the electoral district of San Juan to the sea coast at the point of commencement.

All of which boundaries are delineated and shown bordered pink on a plan numbered X.F.48 dated the 18th day of May, 1956, signed by the Director of Surveys and deposited in his office at Government Buildings in Port-of-Spain.

TUNAPUNA

ALL such parts of the County of St. George as are bounded on the:—

NORTH : By the eastern boundary of the electoral district of St. Joseph from its intersection with the Acono Road in a north-easterly direction till it meets the imaginary line of Co-ordinate E. 406,000 links; thence continuing in an easterly direction along the northern boundary of the Ward of Tacarigua to the eastern boundary of lands acquired by the Crown for the conservation of water supply at Caura.

EAST: Thence along the last mentioned boundary to the south-eastern corner of lands of Maria Ruiz, Lucia Reyes, Francisco Ruiz and Bertha Chang Awai; thence along the northern boundary of lands of T. Dolabaile and M. C. Boneo and continuing along an imaginary line due south-east from the south-western corner of lands of M. Boneo to the north-eastern corner of lands of Edith Hutchinson and south along the eastern boundary of the said lands to its south-eastern corner; thence along the southern boundary of the said lands to St. Michael's Road; thence along the centre line of St. Michael's Road to the Eastern Main Road; thence eastwards along the centre line of the Eastern Main Road to the eastern boundary of Cane Farm Estate to and along the western boundaries of the Piarco Aerodrome and lands now or formerly of Sheldon Estate to the Caroni River.

SOUTH: Thence in a westerly direction along the centre line of the Caroni River to its intersection with the Southern Main Road.

WEST : Thence in a northerly direction along the eastern boundary of the electoral district of St. Joseph to the point of commencement.

All of which boundaries are delineated and shown bordered pink on a plan numbered X.F.47 dated the 18th day of May, 1956, signed by the Director of Surveys and deposited in his office at Government Buildings in Port-of-Spain.

ST. GEORGE EAST

ALL such parts of the County of St. George as are bounded on the:—

NORTH : By a line commencing at the point on the sea coast approximately mid-way between Chupara Point and Abercromby Point (i.e. at the eastern boundary of the electoral district of St. Joseph) and continuing in an easterly direction along the sea coast to the eastern boundary of the County of St. George.

EAST : Thence along the eastern boundary of the County of St. George in a general southerly direction to where it meets the Caroni River (i.e. the confluence of the Aripo and Caroni Rivers).

SOUTH : Thence in a westerly direction along the southern boundary of the Wards of Arima and Tacarigua (i.e., along the centre line of the Caroni River) to the eastern boundary of the electoral district of Tunapuna.

WEST: Thence continuing in a northerly direction along the eastern then northern boundaries of the electoral district of Tunapuna to where it meets the eastern boundary of the electoral district of St. Joseph; thence northwards along the last mentioned boundary to the sea coast at the point of commencement.

All of which boundaries are delineated and shown bordered pink on a plan numbered X.F.47 dated the 18th day of May, 1956, signed by the Director of Surveys and deposited in his office at Government Buildings in Port-of-Spain.

CARONI NORTH

ALL such parts of the Counties of St. George and of Caroni as are bounded on the :—

NORTH : By a line from the mouth of the Caroni River; thence in an easterly direction along the centre line of the Caroni River to the eastern boundary of the Ward of San Rafael.

EAST : By the eastern boundary of the Ward of San Rafael.

SOUTH : By the southern boundary of the Ward of San Rafael from the Cumuto Road westwards along the southern boundary of the County of St. George to the Talparo River and continuing in a northerly direction along the centre line of the Talparo River to where it meets La Gloria Todd's Road; thence along the centre line of the said road and of the Todd's Station Road in a northerly direction along the western boundary of Cunupia Ward to and along the centre line of the Cunupia River in a more or less north-westerly direction; thence along the southern boundaries of lands of J. J. Salas (comprising 10 acres, 1 rood, 18 perches), A. de Seon, Roosial, Safrag and the McNair Ravine Sable Forest Reserve (comprising 415 acres, 1 rood, 9 perches) to the south-eastern corner of lands of E. Stewart; thence southwards along the eastern boundary of lands of W. Jules and thence continuing in a westerly direction along the southern boundary of the said lands and lands of Sheyoung, H. Oliver, B. Lewis, D. Lewis, A. William and C. Maximim, thence southwards along the eastern boundary of lands of F. Pierre to the north-eastern corner of the Longdenville Forest Reserve; thence in a westerly direction along the northern boundary of the said Reserve; thence southwards along the western boundary of the said Reserve to and along the eastern boundary of lands of Ablack comprising 10 acres; thence in a north-westerly direction along the southern boundaries of the said lands and lands of Samjhowni to the north-western corner of lands of Rampal, and continuing along the western boundaries of the said lands to the Trinidad Government Railway line; thence north-westwards along the said line to and along the centre line of a trace on the western boundary of a Reserve; thence in a westerly direction along the northern and western boundaries of lands of Ragoonanan, and thence to the Caparo Valley Brasso Road, continuing northwards and westwards along the centre line of the said road through Montrose Village to and along the centre line of the Chaguanas Main Road in a westerly direction to its junction with the Caroni Savannah Road; thence northwards along the centre line of the said road to and along the centre line of Taitt Street to its junction with Cumberbatch Street; thence southwards along the centre line of Cumberbatch Street to its intersection with the Chaguanas Main Road; thence continuing westwards along the centre line of the said road to where it crosses the Madame Espagnol River; thence along the centre line of the said river to the sea coast.

WEST : From the Madame Espagnol River along the sea coast to the point of commencement.

All of which boundaries are delineated and shown bordered pink on a plan numbered X.F.42 dated the 18th day of May, 1956, signed by the Director of Surveys and deposited in his office at Government Buildings in Port-of-Spain.

CARONI CENTRAL

ALL such parts of the County of Caroni as are bounded on the :—

NORTH : By the southern boundary of the electoral district of Caroni North to where the Talparo River meets the northern boundary of the Central Range Reserve on the County Boundary.

EAST : Continuing along the County Boundary in a westerly and southerly direction to the south-eastern corner of lands of Doobay and Rattunee.

SOUTH : Continuing along the southern boundary of the said lands of Doobay and Rattunee and lands of Toolaran and Bahadoor to a ravine; thence along the centre line of the said ravine to and along the southern boundary of lands of Soodhan continuing in a more or less westerly direction along the southern boundaries of lands of Narainsingh, W. A. Cameron, M. S. Marchan, P. Subero and others to the eastern boundary of lands of F. J. Gomez, continuing along the eastern and southern boundaries of the said lands and lands of M. Schoener and H. Joseph and N. Cole; thence along the western boundary of the said lands and the southern boundary of Crown Lands to the eastern boundary of lands of S. Garcia; thence in a north-westerly direction along the centre line of the Caparo River to and along the centre line of a Ravine across the Trinidad Government Railway line to the Brasso-Caparo Station Road and along the centre line of the said road to its intersection with the Couva Main Road and continuing west along the centre line of the said road crossing the Trinidad Government Railway line to where it meets the Exchange Road.

WEST : Thence in a northerly direction along the centre line of Exchange Road to Waterloo Road; thence in a westerly direction along the centre line of Waterloo Road and the southern boundary of the Ward of Chaguanas to the sea coast and continuing in a northerly direction along the sea coast to the point of commencement.
