AN ORDINANCE to provide that Clyde Valdemar Greenidge shall be deemed to have been accepted as a contributor under the Widows' and Orphans' Pensions Ordinance.

ENACTED by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof. Enactment.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Widows' and Orphans' Pensions (Clyde Valdemar Greenidge) Ordinance, 1957. Short title.

Interpretation.

2. In this Ordinance—

“the Committee” means the Public Service Widows' and Orphans' Pensions Committee established by section 4 of the Ordinance ;

“the Ordinance” means the Widows' and Orphans' Pensions Ordinance.

Clyde Valdemar Greenidge deemed to have been accepted as a contributor under the Widows' and Orphans' Pensions Ordinance, Ch. 9. No. 8.

3. Notwithstanding any provision contained in the Ordinance or any Ordinance amending the same, Clyde Valdemar Greenidge, deceased, former Assistant Teacher in the Education Department of the Colony, shall be deemed to have been entitled to the privileges and benefits of a contributor under the Ordinance with effect from the 22nd day of May, 1952, as if he had undergone a medical examination to the satisfaction of the Committee and had been accepted by the Committee as a contributor.

No refund of contribution to be made.

4. No refund shall be made of any abatement from the salary of the said Clyde Valdemar Greenidge retained by the Accountant General as a contribution under the Ordinance pending his acceptance by the Committee as a contributor.

Passed in Council this third day of May in the year of Our Lord one thousand nine hundred and fifty-seven.
