AN ORDINANCE to make provision for the grant of a pension to the widow of John Cyril Richardson, deceased, former Head Teacher in the Education Department of the Colony.

ENACTED by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof.

Enactment.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the John Cyril Richardson (Widows' and Orphans' Pensions) Ordinance, 1956, and shall be read as one with the Widows' and Orphans' Pensions Ordinance, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

2. Notwithstanding the provisions of any law to the contrary there may be paid out of general revenue to Elinore Catherine Richardson, the widow of John Cyril Richardson, deceased, former Head Teacher in the Education Department of the Colony, a pension at the rate of one hundred and ninety-one dollars and forty-two cents per annum as from the 25th day of December, 1954.

3. The pension payable under and by virtue of this Ordinance shall be in lieu of any pension to which, but for the provisions of this Ordinance, the said widow of the said deceased might have been entitled under and by virtue of the Principal Ordinance, and the provisions of the Principal Ordinance shall be deemed to have had effect and shall have effect in relation to the said pension as if the said John Cyril Richardson had before his retirement from the public service been found eligible to be, and had been accepted by the Committee as, a contributor for the purposes of sections 19 and 22 of the Principal Ordinance, as enacted by the Widows' and Orphans' Pensions (Amendment) Ordinance, 1952-1953.

Passed in Council this twenty-fifth day of May, in the year of Our Lord one thousand nine hundred and fifty-six.
