TRINIDAD AND TOBAGO
Act No. 24 of 1965

[L.S.]

AN ACT to provide for the Incorporation of a Body to be known as the Incorporated Trustees of the Unity Faith Healing Church in Trinidad and Tobago.

[Assented to 6th November, 1965]

WHEREAS there has been established in Trinidad and Preamble Tobago a religious association known as the Unity Faith Healing Church (hereinafter called "the Group") which is representative of the United Group in Trinidad and Tobago:

And Whereas Agatha David, Superintendent and Permanent Trustee of the Group, Beresford Thompson, Edmund Bristol and Evelyn Antoine of Trinidad and Tobago have been appointed Trustees of the Unity Faith Healing Church in Trinidad and Tobago by the said Group:

And Whereas the said Trustees so appointed have been requested and they have agreed to accept the office as such Trustees to represent the said Unity Faith Healing Church in Trinidad and Tobago and to hold property for any of the uses or purposes of the said Group:

And Whereas it is expedient that the Trustees for the time being of the said Unity Faith Healing Church should be incorporated and should have powers to hold lands and other property in trust for the said Group.

Enactment

Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Representatives of Trinidad and Tobago, and by the authority of the same as follows:—

Short title

1. This Act may be cited as "The Unity Faith Healing Church Incorporation Act, 1965".

**Incorporation
of Trustees**

2. Agatha David, Superintendent and Permanent Trustee of the Group, Beresford Thompson, Edmund Bristol and Evelyn Antoine and their successors in office as Trustees of the Unity Faith Healing Church in Trinidad and Tobago shall be and are hereby created a body corporate by the name of "The Incorporated Trustees of the Unity Faith Healing Church in Trinidad and Tobago" (hereinafter called "the Trustees") and by that name shall have perpetual succession and also by that name may sue and be sued and shall have a common seal with power to change such seal.

**Vesting of
Property**

3. All churches, chapels, mission houses, rectories, vicarages, parsonages, glebes, buildings and lands now vested in any person and appropriated to the uses of the Unity

Faith Healing Church in Trinidad and Tobago are hereby transferred to and vested in the Trustees.

4. Subject to the rules, regulations and control of the Group in Trinidad and Tobago, the trustees shall have full power to acquire for the Unity Faith Healing Church by gift, grant, purchase, devise or otherwise any lands, buildings, messuages and hereditaments of what nature or kind soever in perpetuity or for life or lives, or for a term of years, and also any moneys, goods and chattels, and subject to such rules, regulations and control aforesaid, and to the performance of any trust upon which the said lands, buildings, messuages, hereditaments, moneys, goods and chattels may have been acquired, to take, hold and enjoy the same. Trustees may acquire property

5. Subject to the rules, regulations and control aforesaid and to the performance of any such trusts as aforesaid, and except as hereinafter provided, the Trustees may sell, demise, grant, convey, transfer, alienate or otherwise dispose of any property by this Act vested in them, or which may hereafter be acquired by or become vested in them. Trustees may dispose of property

6. All documents requiring the seal of the Trustees shall be sealed with the Common Seal of the Trustees in the presence of two of the Trustees who shall sign every such document, and such signing shall be prima facie evidence that the said seal was duly affixed and that it is the lawful seal of the Trustees. Mode of Execution of documents

7. (1) The Trustees shall at all times have a fixed address for the service of documents on the Trustees and such that the said seal was duly affixed and that it is the lawful seal of the Trustees. Service of documents on Trustees

7. (1) The Trustees shall at all times have a fixed address for the service of documents on the Trustees and such address and any change thereof shall be registered with the Registrar General. Service of documents on Trustees

(2) Any document may be served on the Trustees by leaving the same at, or by sending the same by registered post to, the address as registered under subsection (1) of this section.

Saving of
Crown and
other rights

8. Nothing in this Act shall affect or be deemed to affect the rights of Her Majesty, Her Heirs and Successors or of any bodies politic or corporate or of any other persons, except such as are mentioned in this Act and those claiming by, from, or under them.
