Act No. 18 of 1964

[L.S.]

An Act to amend the statutes relating to the Municipalities.

[Assented to 18th July, 1964]

BE IT ENACTED by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by Enactment and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Representatives of Trinidad and Tobago, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the Municipal Corporations Short title Ordinances (Miscellaneous Amendment) Act, 1964.
