## Act No. 18 of 1964

[L.S.]

AN ACT to amend the statutes relating to the Municipalities.

*[Assented to 18th July, 1964]*

BE IT ENACTED by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by <sup>Enactment</sup> and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Representatives of Trinidad and Tobago, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the Municipal Corporations <sup>Short title</sup> Ordinances (Miscellaneous Amendment) Act, 1964.

3. Subsection (2) of section 12 of the Interpretation Act applies in the construction of the amendments made pursuant to this Act.
