Act No. 26 of 1966

AN ACT for the Incorporation of the Divine Life Society
of Trinidad and Tobago

[Assented to 24th August, 1966]

BE IT ENACTED by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty ^{Enactment}
by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and
House of Representatives of Trinidad and Tobago and
by the authority of the same, as follows :—

1. This Act may be cited as the Divine Life Society of ^{Short title}
Trinidad and Tobago (Incorporation) Act, 1966.

Incorporation
of body

2. The Society known as the Divine Life Society of Trinidad and Tobago shall be and is hereby created a body corporate and by that name shall have perpetual succession, and may sue and be sued in the courts of justice in the Territory by that name and shall have and shall use a common seal which may from time to time change in accordance with the rules of the said body corporate. The said body corporate is hereinafter referred to in this Act as the Society.

Power to acquire
and dispose of
real and personal
property

3. The Society shall have power to :—

- (a) to acquire by purchase, exchange, gift, bequest devise or otherwise, all messuages, lands tenements and hereditaments of any tenure and also all monies, securities for money, goods or chattels whatsoever and may hold and enjoy the same;
- (b) to accept surrenders and reconveyances and to enter into contracts;
- (c) to sell, demise, grant, convey, mortgage, reconvey, surrender, exchange or otherwise dispose of all or any property from time to time vested in it.

Mode of execution
of documents

4. All documents requiring the seal of the Society shall be sealed with the common seal of the Society in the presence of two of the Trustees and its President for the time being in office who shall sign every such document and such signing shall be prima facie evidence that the said seal was duly affixed and that the same is the lawful seal of the Society.

Registration of
address for service
of documents and
manner of service

5. The Society shall have at all times a permanent address in the Territory of Trinidad and Tobago for the service of documents on the Society and such address shall be registered with the Registrar General. All documents to be served on the Society may be served by leaving the same at, or by sending the same by registered post to the address so registered.

Saving of Crown
and other rights

6. Nothing in this Act shall affect or be deemed to affect the rights of Her Majesty, Her Heirs or Successors, or of any body politic or corporate or of any other persons except such as are mentioned in this Act and those claiming by from or under them.
