Act No. 3 of 1966

AN ACT to amend the law relating to currency.

[Assented to 4th February, 1966]

BE IT ENACTED by The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, Enactment
by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and
House of Representatives of Trinidad and Tobago, and by
the authority of the same, as follows :—

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the Currency Act, 1966. Short title and commencement
- (2) This Act shall be deemed to have come into operation on the 1st day of January, 1966.

Interpretation

2. In this Act—

“coin” has the meaning assigned to it by section 2 of the Currency Act, 1965;

“Minister” has the meaning assigned to it by section 2 of the Currency Act, 1965.

Coin to continue to be Legal Tender.
No. 23 of 1964.
No. 3 of 1965.

3. Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection (4) of section 21 of the Central Bank Act, 1964, and the provisions of subsection (1) of section 5 of the Currency Act, 1965, coin shall continue to be legal tender in Trinidad and Tobago until the 30th day of June, 1967 or such earlier date as the Minister may determine by notice published in the *Gazette*.
