AN ORDINANCE to confer full diplomatic privileges and immunities within the Territory upon the Special Representative of the United States of America to The West Indies and to authorise the conferment of full diplomatic privileges and immunities upon representatives of other overseas countries.

[20th July, 1961.]

Commencement.

ENACTED by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof.

Enactment.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Overseas Countries Representatives Immunities Ordinance, 1961.

Short title.

2. (1) The Special Representative appointed by the President of the United States of America to represent that country in The West Indies is hereby accorded and may enjoy within the Territory of Trinidad and Tobago all the privileges, immunities, exemptions and other benefits that are for the time being had and enjoyed by the Ambassador of a foreign country accredited to the Court of St. James in the United Kingdom.

(2) This section has effect from the 14th day of July, 1961.

3. The persons named by the Governor in Council by notice in the *Royal Gazette* as being persons duly appointed to represent the interests of any overseas country in The West Indies shall have and enjoy in the Territory of Trinidad and Tobago all the privileges, immunities, exemptions and other benefits that are for the time being had and enjoyed by the Ambassador of a foreign country accredited to the Court of St. James in the United Kingdom.

Cessation of  
Ordinance.

4. The Governor in Council may, by order in the *Royal Gazette*, declare that the need for the special provisions of this Ordinance no longer exists and from the date specified in such order this Ordinance shall cease to have effect.
