TRINIDAD AND TOBAGO
Act No. 29 of 1970

[L.S.]

AN ACT to provide for the Incorporation of a Body to be known as the Pentecostal United Holy Church of Trinidad and Tobago.

[Assented to 19th August, 1970]

WHEREAS there has been established in Trinidad and Tobago a religious body known as the Pentecostal United Holy Church of Trinidad and Tobago (hereinafter called "The Church"), situate at No. 7 Nepaul Street, St. James, in the City of Port-of-Spain.

And whereas a representative body of the Unit Churches of the Church (hereinafter called "the General Convocation") has been constituted comprising the Superintendent, Pastors and Elders of the Church and representatives of the Unit Churches.

And whereas the Reverend Ishmael Collymore by virtue of his office as Superintendent of the Church and McKenzie Lessy, Dennis Vincent, Lennard Mathlin, David Yearwood, Carmen Collymore, and Lyris Griffith have been elected as trustees of the Church by the General Convocation.

And whereas the Trustees so elected have been requested and they have agreed to accept the office as such in Trinidad and Tobago and to hold property for any of the uses or purposes of the Church in Trinidad and Tobago.

And whereas it is expedient that the Trustees for the time being of the Church should be incorporated and should have powers to hold land and other property in trust for the Church.

Enactment

BE IT ENACTED by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Representatives of Trinidad and Tobago and by the authority of the same as follows:—

Short Title

1. This Act may be cited as the Pentecostal United Holy Church of Trinidad and Tobago Incorporation Act, 1970.

Incorporation of Trustees

2. The Reverend Ishmael Collymore and his successors in office as Superintendent of the Pentecostal United Holy Church of Trinidad and Tobago and McKenzie Lessy, Dennis Vincent, Lennard Mathlin, David Yearwood, Carmen Collymore and Lyris Griffith and their successors in Office as Trustees of the Pentecostal United Holy Church of Trinidad and Tobago shall be and are hereby created a body corporate by the name of the Pentecostal United Holy Church of Trinidad and Tobago (hereinafter called "the Trustees") and by that name shall have perpetual succession and also by that name may sue and be sued and shall have a Common Seal with power to change such seal.

3. All churches, chapels, mission houses, rectories, vicarages, parsonages, glebes, buildings and lands belonging to the Church are hereby transferred to and vested in the Trustees of the Pentecostal United Holy Church of Trinidad and Tobago.

Transfer to and vesting of lands in Trustees

4. Subject to the rules regulations and control of the General Convocation the Trustees shall have full power to acquire for the Pentecostal United Holy Church of Trinidad and Tobago by gift, grant, purchase, demise, exchange or otherwise any lands, buildings, messuages and hereditaments of what nature or kind soever in perpetuity or for life or lives and for a term of years and also any moneys, goods and chattels and subject to such rules regulations and control aforesaid and to the performance of any trust upon which the said lands, buildings, messuages, hereditaments, moneys, goods and chattels may have been acquired to take hold and enjoy the same.

Power to acquire real and personal property

5. Subject to the rules regulations and control aforesaid and to the performance of any trust as aforesaid the Trustees may sell, demise, grant, convey, transfer, surrender, alienate or otherwise dispose of any property by this Act vested in them or which may hereafter be acquired by or become vested in them.

Power to dispose of real and personal property

6. (1) The Pentecostal United Holy Church of Trinidad and Tobago shall at all times have a fixed address in Trinidad and Tobago for the service of documents on the Church and such address or any change thereof shall be registered with the Registrar General.

Service of documents on the Church

(2) Any document may be served on the Church by leaving the same at or by sending the same by registered post to the address as registered under subsection (1) of this section.

7. Nothing in this Act shall affect or be deemed to affect the rights of Her Majesty Her Heirs successors or of any bodies politic or corporate or of any persons except such as are mentioned in this Act and those claiming by through from or under them.

Saving of Crown and other rights
