Act No. 14 of 1970

AN ACT to amend the law relating to Municipal
Corporations.

[Assented to 2nd June, 1970]

BE IT ENACTED by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, ^{Enactment}
by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and
House of Representatives of Trinidad and Tobago, and by
the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the Municipal Corporations ^{Short title}
Ordinances (Amendment) Act, 1970.

3. (1) The Governor-General may make regulations prescribing the expenses, honorarium and allowances required by sections 16, 16A, 16B and 18 of the Port-of-Spain Corporation Ordinance and sections 16, 16A, 16B and 19 of the San Fernando Corporation Ordinance and of the Arima Corporation Ordinance, respectively, to be prescribed.

(2) Regulations made under this section shall be subject to negative resolution of Parliament.
