AN ACT to vary the sums appropriated to Heads of Expenditure set out in the Appropriation Act, 1971.

[Assented to 28th April, 1972]

BE IT ENACTED by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by Enactment and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Representatives of Trinidad and Tobago, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the Finance (Variation of Short title Appropriation) Act, 1972.

2. (1) In this Act and in any other enactment, a reference to the Appropriation Act, 1971, shall be construed as a reference to that Act as for the time being varied, or otherwise amended by any Finance (Variation of Appropriation) Act, passed before this or that other enactment.

(2) A reference to the Appropriation Act, 1970, in the following enactments:—

No. 26 of 1971

(a) the Finance (Variation of Appropriation) (No. 2) Act, 1971; and

No. 27 of 1971

(b) the Finance (Variation of Appropriation) (No. 3) Act, 1971,

No. 51 of 1971

shall be read as a reference to the Appropriation Act, 1971.

(3) Subsection (2) shall be deemed to have come into operation contemporaneously with the enactments referred to in paragraphs (a) and (b) thereof, respectively.

3. The sums appropriated to the several Heads of Expenditure set out in the First Column of Part I of the Schedule by the Appropriation Act, 1971, are hereby increased by the amounts specified in the Second Column of the said Part I.

Reduction in
certain Heads of

4. The sums appropriated to the several Heads of Expenditure set out in the First Column of Part II of the Schedule by the Appropriation Act, 1971, are hereby reduced by the amounts specified in the Second Column of the said Part II.

5. Notwithstanding anything contained in the Exchange and Audit Ordinance, 1959, the sums appropriated in respect of Heads of Expenditure set out in the First Column of Part II of the Schedule by the Appropriation Act, 1971, and unissued at the commencement of this Act may be utilised for the discharge of any liability incurred by the reason of the increase of expenditure in respect of the Heads set out in the First Column of Part I of the Schedule.
