AN ACT to incorporate the Cheshire Foundation Homes
for the Sick (Trinidad and Tobago).

[Assented to 8th September, 1967]

WHEREAS there has been established in Trinidad and Tobago a Foundation known as the Cheshire Foundation Homes for the Sick (Trinidad and Tobago): Preamble

And whereas it is expedient that the said Foundation should be incorporated for the purpose of carrying out the functions and exercising the powers hereinafter set forth:

Enactment

BE IT ENACTED by The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Representatives of Trinidad and Tobago, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

Short title

1. This Act may be cited as the Cheshire Foundation Homes for the Sick (Trinidad and Tobago) (Incorporation) Act, 1967.

Incorporation of the Foundation

2. The Foundation known as the Cheshire Foundation Homes for the Sick (Trinidad and Tobago) is hereby created a body corporate by the name of "The Cheshire Foundation Homes for the Sick (Trinidad and Tobago)" (herein referred to as "the foundation").

Functions of the Foundation

3. The functions of the Foundation are:—

- (a) to provide and maintain shelter and care and sheltered employment for the chronic sick and permanently disabled from any cause whatever;
- (b) to invite the active co-operation of Ministries and Departments of the Government, hospitals, nursing-homes, educational institutions, research foundations and other organisations in promoting the study of the care of the sick;
- (c) to seek the active co-operation and participation of individuals and of commercial, industrial and professional bodies in the care of the sick;
- (d) to establish, subsidise, promote, take over, co-operate or amalgamate with or become a member of, or become affiliated to, or act as trustee or agent for any organisation, society or body of persons, corporate or unincorporate having objects similar in whole or in part to those of the Foundation or calculated directly to advance these objects or any of them;
- (e) to print and publish or cause to be printed or published and to circulate or cause to be circulated whether gratuitously or not any periodicals, books, pamphlets or other documents that may be deemed desirable for the promotion of the objects of the Foundation;

- (f) to do all such other acts and things as are incidental to the attainment of the objects of the Foundation, and generally to promote the interests of the sick in Trinidad and Tobago.

4. (1) Subject to the provisions of any law (including this Act) and any Rules thereunder from time to time in force, the Foundation shall have the powers hereinafter set forth and such other powers as are appropriate to its objects and are from time to time specified in any such Rules, that is to say—

- (a) to acquire by purchase, transfer, donation, exchange, devise, bequest, grant, gift, conveyance or howsoever otherwise, any real or personal property or interest therein;
- (b) to accept surrenders and re-conveyances and to enter into contracts;
- (c) subject to any restraint, reservation or condition contained in any document under which the Foundation shall have acquired title thereto, to sell, demise, mortgage or otherwise dispose of and deal with, any property which may from time to time be vested in or acquired by the Foundation.

(2) The powers conferred by subsection (1) shall be exercised subject to the Rules of the Foundation.

5. All documents requiring the seal of the Foundation shall be sealed with its common seal in the presence of the Chairman of the Management Committee, or if the Chairman is not available, a member of the Management Committee nominated by that Committee for the purpose, and the Secretary, who shall both sign every such document, and such signing shall be *prima facie* evidence that the said seal was duly affixed and that the same is the lawful seal of the Foundation.

6. The Foundation shall at all times have a fixed address for the service of documents on the Foundation and such address shall be registered with the Registrar General. Any document may be served on the Foundation by leaving the same at, or sending the same by registered post to, the address so registered.

7. The Foundation may make Rules for the conduct of its proceedings and for the discharge of its duties.

Saving of
Crown or
other rights

8. Nothing in this Act shall affect the rights of Her Majesty, Her Heirs or Successors, or of any bodies politic or corporate or of any other persons except such as are mentioned or referred to in this Act or those claiming by, through, from or under them.
