Act No. 6 of 1969

AN ACT to make special provision for the grant of a gratuity to John Williams, formerly employed as a temporary Field Attendant Grade I in the Ministry of Health.

[Assented to 12th March, 1969]

BE IT ENACTED by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, ^{Enactment} by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Representatives of Trinidad and Tobago, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the John Williams (Gratuity) ^{Short title} Act, 1969.

2. Notwithstanding anything contained in any law relating to the grant of gratuity, there may be paid from the Consolidated Fund to John Williams, formerly employed as a temporary Field Attendant Grade I in the Ministry of Health, in respect of his services as a temporary Field Attendant Grade I, a gratuity of one thousand six hundred and thirty six dollars and eighty cents.
