AN ORDINANCE to alter the scale of plans to be made under an Ordinance entitled "An Ordinance for encouraging the formation of Tram Roads."

**W**HEREAS by an Ordinance passed in Council on the twenty-second day of May, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty-six, entitled "An Ordinance for encouraging the formation of Tram Roads," it is amongst other things enacted, that every petition to the Central Road Board under the said Ordinance shall be accompanied by a plan on a scale of one inch to six chains, each of sixty-six feet: And whereas it is expedient that such plans should be made on a scale of one inch to four hundred feet, being the scale on which the maps of the lands in the several wards of the Island, kept by the Secretary of the Central Road Board, are directed to be made: Be it enacted by His Excellency the Governor by and with the advice and consent of the Council of Government--

1. That all plans to be made under the said Ordinance of the twenty-second day of May aforesaid shall be on a scale of one inch to four hundred feet and on no other scale.
2. That where any petition already made to the Central Road Board under the said Ordinance of the twenty-second day of May aforesaid shall have been accompanied by a plan on a scale of one inch to four hundred feet no objection shall be taken to such petition or such plan by reason of such plan not being on the scale required by the said Ordinance.

Passed in Council this first day of April, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty-seven.
