

this Ordinance may be persons unknown to the officers and other persons acting under this Ordinance, be it therefore enacted, That it shall be lawful for any police constable, acting with such aid as shall be necessary, and without any warrant or other authority to apprehend and detain any such unknown person guilty of any offence against this Ordinance, and forthwith to convey him before any Justice of the Peace having jurisdiction within the Town of Port of Spain, and such Justice of the Peace is hereby required to proceed and deal with respect to such offender according to the provisions of this Ordinance.

AN ORDINANCE to authorise the Governor to fix the days for the hearing of Actions and Suits in the Petty Civil Courts of the several Police Districts.

WHEREAS by an Ordinance passed in Council on the first day of August in the year of Our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-one, and entitled "An Ordinance for the establishing of Petty Civil Courts," it is among other things enacted, That the Commissioner at such place in the Town of Port of Spain, as the Governor shall from time to time appoint, and the Stipendiary Justice at the Police Office of the District shall sit for the hearing of actions and suits on the

Saturday in each week during the year: And whereas it is expedient to give the Governor authority to appoint the days on which the Stipendiary Justices shall sit in their several districts for the hearing of actions and suits under the said recited Ordinance: Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Council of Government, That it shall be lawful for the Governor by Proclamation under his hand and seal, from time to time, to fix and appoint the days on which the several Stipendiary Justices, within their several districts, shall sit for the hearing of all actions and suits under the said recited Ordinance of the first day of August, and to alter the same as he shall see fit, anything in the said recited Ordinance to the contrary notwithstanding.
