AN ORDINANCE for the election of Auditors in certain cases where Auditors have not been elected, and to alter the times and places for the election of Auditors.

CHARLES ELLIOT.

WHEREAS by an Ordinance passed in Council on the first day of October, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-two, and entitled "An Ordinance for amending and consolidating the Law with regard to the appointment of Wardens and the powers and duties of such Wardens," it is enacted that there shall be elected annually in and for each ward two Auditors and that the election of such Auditors after the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty-two shall be held on the first Tuesday in the month of September in each year: and whereas in several wards of the Colony no election of Auditors has been held in this present year: and whereas it is expedient to make provision for the election of Auditors in such cases, and to give Authority to the Wardens to appoint the times and places for the election of Auditors after this present year: Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor with the advice and consent of the Council of Government, that in each ward for which no Auditors have been elected in this present year an election of Auditors shall be held on such day in the month of December now next ensuing, and at such place within the ward as the Warden of the Ward Union in which such ward shall be included shall,

by notice to be published in the *Royal Gazette*, and also by affixing a copy of the same at some conspicuous place within such ward appoint for that purpose.

2. And be it enacted, That in every year after the present year the election of Auditors for each ward shall be held on such day in the month of September, and at such place within the ward as the Warden of the Ward Union in which such ward shall be included shall by notice in the *Royal Gazette*, and also by affixing a copy of the same at some conspicuous place within such ward appoint for that purpose.

3. And be it enacted, That every election of Auditors shall in all respects not otherwise provided for by this Ordinance be held in the same manner as directed by the said Ordinance of the first day of October, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-two.
