AN ORDINANCE for facilitating the granting of Letters of Administration.

CHARLES ELLIOT.

WHEREAS it is expedient that facilities should be given for the granting of Letters of Administration to persons resident within the Colony without citation to other persons having a prior right to such Letters of Administration, but not resident within the Colony: Be it enacted by His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Council of Government, that it shall be lawful for the Supreme Civil Court to grant Letters of Administration of the estate and effects within this Colony of any person already dead, or who may hereafter depart this life, to any person resident within the Colony who would otherwise be entitled to the same without any previous citation to or the consent of any other party having a prior right to administration, but not resident or actually living within the limits of the Colony: Provided always that

such Letters of Administration shall be granted with reservation of the right of the party having such prior right.

AN ORDINANCE to regulate the charge for Water supplied from the Port of Spain Water Works, and for the better enforcing the payment of the Rates for Water.*

CHARLES ELLIOT.

WHEREAS an Ordinance was passed in Council on the eighteenth day of November, in the year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty-one, entitled "An Ordinance for supplying the Town of Port of Spain and the vicinity thereof with Water:" and whereas the works contemplated by the said Ordinance have been nearly completed, and water has been brought into the town of Port of Spain from the rivers Maraval and St. Ann: And whereas it is expedient to make provision as to the rates to be paid for water supplied to houses from the said works, and for the better enforcing the payment of such rates and of the rate of one pound

Rates to be levied.
