And be it enacted, That where any manufactory or trade or public work shall be established in any house to which water shall be supplied from the said water works it shall be lawful for the Superintendent of Public Works to fix and declare such higher rate for the use of the water supplied to such house according to the nature of the manufactory established therein as he shall see fit.

AN ORDINANCE to make certain amendments and alterations in an Ordinance entitled “ An Ordinance for amending and consolidating the law with regard to the appointment of Wardens, and the powers and duties of such Wardens.”*

WHEREAS an Ordinance was passed in Council on the first day of October, one thousand eight hundred any fifty-two, entitled “ An Ordinance for

amending and consolidating the law with regard to the appointment of Wardens, and the powers and duties of such Wardens;" and whereas it is expedient to alter and amend the same in some particulars, and to make further provisions for the government of the several Wards in the Colony: Be it enacted by His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Council of Government, that it shall be lawful for the Governor by proclamation under his hand, from time to time to form such and so many Wards as he shall see fit, into Ward Unions, and to declare by what name each such Ward Union shall be known and distinguished, and from time to time to alter the numbers or names of such Unions, and the Wards included in any such Union.

2. And be it enacted, That it shall be lawful for the Governor from time to time to appoint one warden for the several Wards comprised in such Union, and every such warden shall hold his office during the pleasure of the Governor, and shall have and exercise such and the same powers in each ward comprised in such Union as any warden now hath by law within his ward, and on the appointment of any such warden the powers and authorities of the warden of any ward comprised in such Union, shall actually cease and determine.
