

possessions abroad to make enactments similar to the enactment of the Act Ninth, George the Fourth, chapter thirty-one, section eight." That where any person, being feloniously stricken, poisoned, or otherwise hurt, at any place within the limits of this Colony, shall die of such stroke, poisoning or hurt upon the sea or at any place out of the limits of this Colony, every offence committed in respect of any such case, whether the same shall amount to the offence of Murder or of Manslaughter, or of being accessory before the fact to murder, or after the fact to Murder or Manslaughter, shall and may be dealt with, inquired of, tried, determined and punished in this Colony in the same manner in all respects as if such offence had been wholly committed within the limits of this Colony.

AN ORDINANCE to authorise the advance of additional moneys for improving the Quays of the Town of Port of Spain.

WHEREAS an Ordinance was passed in Council on the first day of November, in the year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight, entitled "An Ordinance for improving the Quays of the Town of Port of Spain:" under which Ordinance authority was given to the Governor to advance the sum of twenty thousand pounds for the purposes of such improvement: And whereas it is expedient that further moneys should be advanced from the Colonial Treasury for the purposes of the said Ordinance: Be it enacted by His Excellency the Governor by and

with the advice and consent of the Council of Government as follows:—

1. It shall be lawful for the Governor to issue from the Colonial Treasury to the Commissioners for the time being under the said Ordinance, and for the purposes of the said Ordinance such further sums of money in addition to the sum of twenty thousand pounds mentioned in the said Ordinance as the Governor may from time to time see fit, not exceeding in the whole the further sum of twenty thousand pounds, and all such further moneys may be issued to any three of such Commissioners.
2. For the repayment of the moneys to be advanced under the authority of this Ordinance there shall be raised and paid to Her Majesty the Queen the several duties of Wharfage specified in the Schedule to the said recited Ordinance of the first day of November on all packages, goods, and merchandise mentioned in the said Schedule.
3. Provided always, That it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, by resolution from time to time to establish a new Tariff of Duties to be taken in lieu of those specified in the said recited Ordinance, and from time to time to vary any of the duties specified in such new Tariff; and such new Tariff or any alteration of the same shall come into force on such day as the Governor in Council may from time to time appoint in that behalf, and from the day which may be so appointed the duties payable under such new Tariff, or any alteration of the same shall be taken and paid in lieu of the duties payable under any former Tariff.
4. It shall be lawful for the Governor from time to time to appoint such persons as he shall see fit to be Commissioners under the said Ordinance in lieu of any Commissioners who may be now dead, or who may hereafter depart this life or resign.
5. The southern frontage of the New Quay to be erected under the said Ordinance instead of being extended to the point indicated by the letter B in the map or plan referred to in the said Ordinance shall be carried out no further than to a point at which the

South Quay will meet a straight line extended to the southward from the western side of the St. Vincent's Wharf, and from that point to the point indicated by the letter C in the said map or plan.

6. No moneys shall be expended for the purpose of reclaiming the lands to the eastward of a line drawn to the southward from the Prolongation of Charlotte Street, until the works to the westward of the said line shall have been completed.

7. It shall be lawful for the Commissioners under the said Ordinance to lay down and maintain a Tramway across the King's Wharf unto and over the land already recovered or to be recovered from the sea in front of the South Quay and of the St. Vincent Wharf to such point or points to the westward of the St. Vincent Wharf as the Commissioners shall see fit; and also to lay down and maintain another Tramway from the Laventille Quarry unto and over the Prolongation of King Street, and thence over the Dry River unto and over the south side of King Street to the St. Vincent Wharf.

8. The accounts of the Commissioners in respect of the moneys received by them under the authority of the said Ordinance of the first day of November aforesaid shall be laid by the Commissioners before the Auditor General and audited by him within three calendar months from the day of the passing of this Ordinance; and the accounts of such Commissioners in respect of all moneys to be hereafter received and expended by such Commissioners up to the thirtieth day of June, and the thirty-first day of December of each year, shall be laid before the Auditor General within two calendar months next after each of those days respectively, and audited by the Auditor General; and a copy of the accounts so audited shall from time to time be laid before the Council of Government.
