5. The Receiver General shall, in the account of Tramroad Debentures kept at the Colonial Treasury, distinguish all such Debentures as shall be made payable at the office of the Colonial Agent.

AN ORDINANCE to authorize the advance of additional Moneys for the formation of Tramroads.

ROB. W. KEATE.

WHEREAS an Ordinance was passed in Council on the twenty-second day of May, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-six, entitled "An Ordinance for encouraging the formation of Tramroads:" And whereas it is expedient that in any case where the moneys specified in any Final Order made by virtue of the said Ordinance, may not be sufficient for the completion of the tramroad mentioned in such Order, power should be given to the said Board to authorise the advance of further moneys for the completion of such tramroad: Be it enacted by His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Council of Government, as follows:

1. It shall be lawful for the Central Road Board, if the said Board shall see fit from time to time, on the

petition of the owner of any lands lying between the proposed termini of any tramroad, for the formation of which a final Order shall have been made, or may hereafter be made by the said Board, and which lands shall be chargeable with the repayment of any part of the moneys advanced for the formation of such tramroad, by virtue of the Charging Order made by the said Board in that behalf; and on its being made to appear to the said Board that the moneys mentioned in such Charging Order, or in any Order in Aid, to be made under the authority of this Ordinance are not sufficient for the completion of such tramroad to make an Order in Aid, and by such Order to direct that such further moneys as the Board shall from time to time deem necessary shall be advanced for the completion of such tramroad.

2. No such Order in Aid shall be made on any such petition by the Central Road Board until after the expiration of four calendar months next, after such petition shall have been first published in the *Royal Gazette*, unless such petition shall be signed by the owners, or the attorneys or agents of the owners of all lands mentioned in, and chargeable under the original Charging Order, in which case such Order in Aid may be made at any time after the presentation of the petition praying for such Order in Aid.

3. All moneys for the advance, whereof any such Order in Aid shall be made, shall be a debt to Her Majesty, and shall bear interest at the rate of six pounds for every one hundred pounds by the year, from the day of the date of such order, and such moneys, and the interest for the same shall be a charge on the several plantations and lands mentioned in and chargeable under the Final Order, made in respect of such tramroad in the like proportions, in which the moneys mentioned in such Final Order are charged on such plantations and lands respectively, and shall be payable by twenty-four equal annual payments.

4. On making any such Order in Aid the Central Road Board shall make a separate Order, to be called "An Additional Charging Order," which additional Charging Order shall be according to the form in the schedule to this Ordinance, and shall be under the seal

of the said Board, and signed by the Secretary of the said Board, and such additional Charging Order shall specify the names of the several plantations and lands, or if the names thereof be not known then of the owners of the several plantations or lands to be charged with the payment of the moneys for the advance whereof such Order in Aid shall be made, and interest on the same, and shall also specify the several annual payments to be made in respect of such plantations and lands respectively for the payment of such moneys and interest on the same.

5. Such annual payments shall be payable to the Receiver-General on the thirty-first day of March of every year, and the first payment shall be made on the thirty-first day of March, which shall first happen after the day of the date of such additional Charging Order.

6. Every such additional Charging Order shall be enregistered in the office of the Registrar General without any fee or payment for the same, and shall have the same priority, force, and effect as is given by the Ordinance of the twenty-second day of May aforesaid, to any Charging Order made under the said Ordinance ; and it shall not be lawful for any person to question any such additional Charging Order for anything whatever, done or omitted to be done under the provisions of this Ordinance, or for any other reason whatsoever.

7. The annual payments to be mentioned in such additional Charging Order shall be recoverable by such Warden, and in such manner as is provided by the said Ordinance of the twenty-second day of May aforesaid.

8. The said Ordinance of the twenty-second day of May, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-six, and this Ordinance shall be construed together in the same manner, as if the provisions of this Ordinance had been incorporated in and formed part of the said recited Ordinance.

ADDITIONAL ORDER IN AID.

The Central Road Board by virtue of the powers vested in the said board by the Ordinance No. 16 of 1859, entitled "An Ordinance to authorize the advance of additional moneys for the formation of Tramroads," do order that the additional sum of shall be applied from and out of the moneys in the Colonial Treasury applicable to the formation of Tramroads in aid of the Tramroad.

ADDITIONAL CHARGING ORDER.

Whereas the Central Road Board, by virtue of the powers vested in the Board by the Ordinance No. 16 of 1859, entitled "An Ordinance to authorize the advance of additional moneys for the formation of Tramroads," have, by their Additional Order in Aid, bearing even date herewith ordered that the additional sum of be applied from and out of the moneys in the Colonial Treasury applicable to the formation of Tramroads in aid of the Tramroad. The Central Road Board, by virtue of the powers vested in the Board by the said Ordinance, do hereby order that the said sum of with interest thereon, at the rate of six pounds per centum per annum be charged upon the several plantations and lands hereinafter mentioned, in the several proportions hereinafter mentioned, and that there shall be paid for and in respect of the said several plantations and lands the several annual payments hereinafter mentioned, which annual payments shall be payable for the term of twenty-four years, and whereof the first payment shall be made on the thirty-first day of March next ensuing the day of the date of this order—that is to say:—
