

one at least of the native languages or dialects of India, and to allow to the persons so employed such reasonable salaries as the Governor may from time to time see fit.

2. Every person appointed as Interpreter under this Ordinance shall hold his office at the pleasure of the Governor.

3. The salaries to be allowed to such Interpreters shall be charged as part of the expenses of Administration of Criminal Justice.

AN ORDINANCE to authorise the Governor to take up Moneys in anticipation of uncollected Public Revenue applicable to Immigration.

ROB. W. KEATE.

WHEREAS it is expedient that authority should be given to the Governor to take up on loan from the Colonial Bank in anticipation of uncollected Revenue applicable to the purposes of Immigration such sums of moneys as may from time to time be required in aid of the Public Revenue, and that the re-payment of all money to be so taken up by way of loan with interest on the same should be charged on the Public Revenues of the Colony: Be it enacted by His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Council of Government as follows:

1. It shall be lawful for the Governor from time to time to take up on loan from the Colonial Bank in anticipation of uncollected Revenue applicable to the purposes of Immigration such sums of money as may from time to time be required in aid of the Public Revenue:

Provided always that the moneys to be so taken up on loan shall not exceed in the whole at any one time the sum of twenty-five thousand pounds sterling.

2. There shall be laid before the Council of Government on its first meeting in each month a return shewing all moneys taken up under the authority of this Ordinance during the preceding month, and the balance due in respect of such moneys on the last day of such preceding month.

3. All sums of money which may be so taken up by way of loan shall be taken up on the warrant of the Governor directed to the Receiver General, and the receipt of the Receiver General for the time being endorsed on such warrant shall be evidence of the fact of the moneys mentioned in such receipt having been taken up under the authority of this Ordinance and of the time of the same having been so taken up.

4. All moneys which may be taken up on loan from the Colonial Bank under the authority of this Ordinance with interest on the same from the respective times of the same being so taken up shall be charged on the Revenue of the Colony.
