AN ORDINANCE for the encouragement of the Breeding of Cattle.

ROB. W. KEATE.

WHEREAS it is expedient to encourage the Breeding of Cattle on the Natural Savannas of the Island, and for that purpose to authorise the reservation on leases by the Crown of any lands being Natural Savanna of Ward Rates lower in amount than the rates specified in the Ordinance passed in Council on the first day of October, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-two, and entitled "An Ordinance for amending and consolidating the law with regard to the appointment of Wardens, and the powers and duties of such Wardens:" Be it enacted by His Excellency the Governor by and with the advice and consent of the Council of Government as follows :

1. It shall be lawful for the Governor on any lease to be granted by the Crown of any lands being Natural Savanna for any term not exceeding fourteen years from the day of the commencement of such lease to determine what annual rate lower than the rates which would otherwise be payable under the said Ordinance of the first day of October aforesaid shall be payable in respect of such lands, and the rate so determined being mentioned in the deed whereby such lands shall be leased, and no higher or other rate shall, during the continuance of the term mentioned in such lease, be payable in respect of such lands, and no rate shall be payable during the continuance of such lease on any house or building erected on such lands solely for the use of the herdsman and servants employed in the care of the stock on such lands.

2. Provided always, That the rate to be reserved on any such lands shall in no case be less than one shilling for every acre of land demised by such lease.

3. Provided also, That if during the continuance of any such lease any part of the lands so demised shall be used for the cultivation or growth of any product,

except artificial grasses for fodder, then and in every such case the higher rate payable under the said recited Ordinance shall be payable in respect of the lands so used.

Passed in Council this seventeenth day of February, in the Year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine.

AN ORDINANCE for the appointment of an Assistant Receiver General.

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor by and with the advice and consent of the Council of Government as follows :

1. That it shall be lawful for Her Majesty the Queen to appoint some person as Assistant Receiver General of the Colony, and in case of his death, resignation or removal from office to appoint some other person in his place, and every such Assistant Receiver General shall hold office during the pleasure of Her Majesty.

2. To every such Assistant Receiver General there shall be paid from the public funds of the Colony a salary at the rate of five hundred pounds per annum.

3. Every such Assistant Receiver General shall act in aid of the Receiver General, and shall (subject to the control of the Receiver General) exercise a general superintendence over the clerks and officers in the department of the Receiver General.
