AN ORDINANCE for uniting the Offices of sub-Collector, and of Assistant Receiver of Taxes.

ROB. W. KEATE.

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor by and with the advice and consent of the Council of Government, as follows :

1. From and after the passing of this Ordinance, the offices of sub-Collector and of Assistant Receiver of Taxes shall be united, and the duties of the said offices, respectively, shall be performed by one and the same person, who shall bear the style or title of sub-Receiver.

2. In case of the death, retirement, or removal from office of James Francis Knox, Esquire, by whom the said offices of sub-Collector and Assistant Receiver of Taxes are now held, or of any other person who shall be appointed in his place, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty to appoint some other person as sub-Receiver.

3. There shall be paid from the Colonial Treasury to such sub-Receiver, a salary at the rate of four hundred pounds sterling per annum, and there shall be allowed to such sub-Receiver, a clerk, who shall be paid from the Colonial Treasury, a salary at the rate of two hundred pounds sterling per annum.

4. Every person to be appointed sub-Receiver shall give security to the satisfaction of the Governor, with

one or more sufficient surety or sureties to be approved by the Governor, the sub-Receiver in the sum of five hundred pounds sterling, and his surety or sureties in the further sum of five hundred pounds sterling, for the due accounting for all moneys which shall come to his hands as sub-Receiver.

5. It shall be lawful for the Governor from time to time, by proclamation, to appoint the several districts or parts of districts, and the places within this Island for which such sub-Receiver shall act as Receiver, and the same from time to time to alter or vary as he shall see fit.

6. From and after such proclamation, all sums of money which under or by virtue of any Order in Council, or Ordinance now in force, or hereafter to be in force may be payable to the Colonial Treasury, or to the Receiver General for the use of the Colony by any person residing within any district, or part of a district or place mentioned in such proclamation, or for or in respect of any tax or duty accruing in any such district shall and may be paid to such sub-Receiver.

7. All moneys which by virtue of any Ordinance now in force, or hereafter to be in force, may be payable to the Receiver General by the Warden of any Ward within any such district, shall and may be paid to such sub-Receiver.

8. It shall be lawful for such sub-Receiver from time to time, from and out of any moneys in his hands belonging to the Crown, to make such payments for the public service, as the Governor by warrant under his hand may from time to time direct.

9. It shall be lawful for such sub-Receiver from time to time, from and out of any moneys in hands belonging to any Ward, to make such payments for the use of such Ward, as the Governor may from time to time direct.

10. Such sub-Receiver shall, within the first ten days in each month, deliver to the Receiver General an account of all moneys belonging to Her Majesty received, and moneys paid by him for the use of the Colony during the next preceding month, together with the warrants

and vouchers for the same, and such accounts shall be audited, and on the same being approved by the Auditor of Public Accounts, the moneys so received and expended shall, on the warrant of the Governor, be entered by the Receiver General under the proper heads of receipt and expenditure in the books of the Treasury.

11. The accounts of such sub-Receiver in respect of the several Wards included within any such district, shall be audited once in every three months by such person or persons as the Governor may from time to time direct.

AN ORDINANCE for establishing a system of underground Sewerage within the Town of Port of Spain.

ROB. W. KEATE.

WHEREAS the public health within the Town of Preamble.
Port of Spain would be greatly promoted by the establishment of a system of underground sewerage: Be it enacted by His Excellency the Governor by and with the advice and consent of the Council of Government as follows:

1. In the Town of Port of Spain and the suburbs thereof there shall be established in the manner hereinafter provided a system of underground sewerage by means of tubular pipes whereby all waste water, soil, and fluid and semi-fluid refuse of all descriptions may be carried off into the sea to the westward of the said Town.
