AN ORDINANCE to authorise the issue of Debentures for sums of one hundred pounds under an Ordinance entitled "An Ordinance for encouraging the formation of Tramroads."

WHEREAS an Ordinance was passed in Council on the twenty-second day of May in the year of our

Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty-six, entitled "An Ordinance for encouraging the formation of Tram-roads," by which Ordinance it is amongst other things provided, that the Debentures to be issued under the said Ordinance shall be made each for the sum of five pounds: And whereas it is expedient to make provision for the issuing under the said Ordinance of Debentures for the sum of one hundred pounds sterling: Be it enacted by His Excellency the Governor by and with the advice and consent of the Council of Government, that when any person shall be desirous of investing in the purchase of Debentures under the said recited Ordinance the sum of one hundred pounds sterling or upwards, it shall be lawful for the Receiver General to issue to such person for every sum of one hundred pounds paid by such person a Debenture for the sum of one hundred pounds in lieu of twenty Debentures of five pounds each.

2. That all Debentures to be issued for the sum of one hundred pounds shall be printed in red ink so as to distinguish the same from Debentures for the sum of five pounds.

3. That every such Debenture for the sum of one hundred pounds shall be expressed to entitle the holder to be paid the sum of one hundred pounds sterling with interest, but no such Debenture shall be transferable except by special endorsation.

4. That all Debentures to be issued under the said recited Ordinance for the sum of five pounds shall be redeemed before any Debenture for the sum of one hundred pounds shall be redeemable.

5. That the said Ordinance of the twenty-second day of May aforesaid shall be construed as if the provisions of this Ordinance had been inserted therein.
