4. For each child attending any school of primary education maintained from public funds there shall be charged a school fee of not less than threepence per week. When two or more children of the same family are attending school the fee for the second child shall be not less than twopence, and for the third child or any additional child not less than one penny per week.

aid will be
granted.

5. No school shall receive aid from public funds the managers of which do not charge payment of school fees at rates not less than those enumerated in the last preceding section; and do not enforce and obtain payment of such proportion of those fees as may from time to time be prescribed by any regulation of the Board of Education.

AN ORDINANCE to amend the Ordinance No. 10 of 1853, intituled "An Ordinance for the Regulation of Municipal Corporations in this Island."

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council, as follows:—

Short title.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as "The Municipal Corporations Amendment Ordinance, 1875."

2. Sections 54, 55 and 67 of Ordinance No. 10 of 1853 are hereby repealed.

3. In lieu of the moneys payable by virtue of the said Ordinance No. 10 of 1853, or of any rule or other law or Ordinance out of the funds and moneys of the

boroughs of Port of Spain and San Fernando respectively in respect of persons admitted into any public hospital, there shall be paid to the Receiver General on behalf of the Government of the Colony in each year commencing from the first day of January, 1876, by equal half-yearly payments on the thirtieth day of June and the thirty-first day of December by the Council of the borough of Port of Spain, the sum of seven hundred and fifty pounds, and by the Council of the borough of San Fernando the sum of two hundred and fifty pounds as an annual contribution to the maintenance of the Government hospitals in the respective boroughs.

4. There shall be paid to the Receiver General on behalf of the Government of the Colony in each year by the Council of the borough of Port of Spain by equal half-yearly payments commencing from the first day of January, 1876, and payable on the thirtieth day of June and the thirty-first day of December in each year, the sum of five hundred pounds annually, and in consideration of such payment the Council of the said borough shall be relieved from the obligation imposed on it by the 61st section of the said Ordinance to maintain primary and infant schools within the limits of the said borough, anything in clause 93 of the said Ordinance No. 10 of 1853 contained to the contrary in anywise notwithstanding.

5. Any person without licence plying as a huckster, pedlar or porter or keeping or using any cart in contravention of the provisions of section 89 of the said Ordinance No. 10 of 1853 shall be guilty of an offence under the Ordinance No. 6 of 1868, intituled "An Ordinance for rendering certain offences punishable on summary conviction," and shall be liable on conviction of each such offence to a penalty not exceeding five pounds or thirty days imprisonment with or without hard labour.
