AN ORDINANCE to Amend the Law as to Burial
Grounds.

10th February, 1876.

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor, with
the advice and consent of the Legislative Council,
as follows :—

Construction. 1. This Ordinance shall be read as one with Ordinance No. 2 of 1873, intituled “An Ordinance for the Licensing of Burial Grounds,” in this Ordinance referred to as the principal Ordinance.

Short titles. 2. The principal Ordinance may be cited for all purposes as “The Burial Grounds Ordinance, 1873.” This Ordinance may be cited for all purposes as “The Burial Grounds Ordinance, 1876,” and the principal Ordinance and this Ordinance together may be cited for all purposes as “The Burial Grounds Ordinances, 1873 and 1876.”

Vesting
public burial
ground in
Her Majesty. 3. As soon as the Governor has under the principal Ordinance set apart and licensed as a public burial ground any land being private property, such land shall vest in Her Majesty, her heirs and successors; free and discharged from all estates, interests, charges, rights, incumbrances or titles whatsoever, in trust, to be devoted to the burial of the dead and separated from all other uses.

Passed in Council this first day of February, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy-six.
