

down, upon such terms and conditions as may be agreed on between the said Board and such person or persons: Provided that every such agreement be carried by a majority of two thirds of the votes represented by the commissioners present at the Board. And every such grant being signed by any three of the said commissioners, of whom the warden for the time being shall be one, shall be irrevocable, and shall have the same effect as if the same had been granted by Her Majesty under the seal of this Island.

2. Every such grant shall be enregistered in the office of the Registrar General.

3. The word "person" in this Ordinance shall extend to and include a body corporate, or joint stock company.

AN ORDINANCE to authorise the Purchase by the Government of the San Fernando Jetty.

(L. S.) HENRY T. IRVING.

18th November, 1875.

WHEREAS by Ordinance No. 19 of 1855, intituled "An Ordinance for constituting a joint stock company to be called the San Fernando Jetty Company" (hereinafter referred to as the San Fernando Jetty Ordinance), the San Fernando Jetty Company was incorporated for the purpose of erecting and maintaining the San Fernando jetty and was empowered to levy certain tolls in respect of the use of such jetty: And whereas subject to the approval of the Legislature of this Colony, His Excellency the Governor has agreed to purchase the said jetty: And whereas it is expedient that the said agreement should be confirmed and carried into effect, and that tolls in respect of the use of the said jetty should cease to be levied: Be it enacted by

His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council, as follows :

Short title.

1. This Ordinance may be cited for all purposes as "The San Fernando Jetty Ordinance 1875."

Power to convey jetty to her Majesty.

2. The San Fernando Jetty Company may sell and convey to Her Majesty the Queen, her heirs and successors, the San Fernando jetty, and may release any estate, right or interest which they have in respect of the said jetty, and for that purpose may execute a conveyance and release under their common seal; and the Governor on behalf of Her Majesty may, in consideration of such conveyance and release, authorise the payment out of the Colonial Treasury to the San Fernando Jetty Company of any sum not exceeding five hundred pounds.

Effect of conveyance of jetty.

3. Upon a release and conveyance under this Ordinance to Her Majesty being executed by the San Fernando Jetty Company, the said jetty with its appurtenances shall be vested in Her Majesty, her heirs and successors, and all the right and estate of the San Fernando Jetty Company therein shall cease and determine, and no tolls shall be leviable in respect of the use of the said jetty.

Application of purchase-money.

4. The purchase-money paid in respect of the said jetty shall be applied first in payment of the debts, if any, of the said company, and the surplus, if any, of such money shall be distributed among the several shareholders of the said company in proportion to their respective shares, and thereupon the said company shall be dissolved.

Amendment of s. 22 of Ordinance 19 of 1855.

5. The powers by the 22nd section of the San Fernando Jetty Ordinance conferred upon the San Fernando Jetty Company or any servant thereof shall from and after the passing of this Ordinance be transferred to or vested in any police constable; and the moneys under such section payable to the Treasurer for the time being of the said company shall be paid into the Colonial Treasury.

Repeal of part of Ordinance 19 of 1855.

6. The enactments specified in the schedule to this Ordinance are hereby repealed: Provided that such repeal shall not affect any right accrued or penalty incurred before the passing of this Ordinance.
