

Be it enacted by His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council, as follows:—

Short title.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as "The Extradition Ordinance (Trinidad), 1877."

Powers of police magistrates in relation to extradition under the Imperial Acts.

2. All powers vested in and acts authorised or required to be done by a police magistrate or any justice of the peace in relation to the surrender of fugitive criminals in the United Kingdom, under "The Extradition Acts, 1870 and 1873," are hereby vested in, and may in this Colony be exercised and done by, any stipendiary justice of the peace, in relation to the surrender of fugitive criminals under the said Acts.

Suspending clause.

3. This Ordinance shall not come into operation until Her Majesty shall by Order in Council direct that this Ordinance shall have effect within this Colony as if it were part of "The Extradition Act, 1870," but this Ordinance shall thereafter come into operation as soon as such Order in Council has been publicly made known in the Colony.

AN ORDINANCE to fix the Security to be given by the Receiver General.

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council, as follows:—

1. Every Receiver General of the Colony shall give security to the satisfaction of the Governor with some sufficient surety or sureties in the sum of two thousand pounds for the due accounting for all moneys that come to his hands as such Receiver General.

Security to be given by Receiver General.

2. The 4th Section of Ordinance No. 17 of 1855, intituled "An Ordinance for the appointment of a Receiver-General of the Colony, and for the abolition of the Offices of Colonial Treasurer and Collector of Customs," is hereby repealed; Provided that such repeal shall not affect the validity of any security given before the passing of this Ordinance.

Repeal of Section 4 of Ordinance 17 of 1855.

3. Upon the Honourable William Rowland Pyne, the present Receiver General of the Colony, giving security according to this Ordinance, the Governor may by order under his hand declare any bond or other security given by the said William Rowland Pyne pursuant to the said 4th Section of the Ordinance No. 17 of 1855, to be void from the date of such order: Provided that this enactment shall not affect any right, remedy, or liability accrued or incurred before such order.

Proviso as to present Receiver General.

Passed in Council this first day of May, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven.
