AN ORDINANCE with respect to the Petty Civil Court in Port-of-Spain.

WHEREAS the office of Commissioner of the Petty Civil Court of Port-of-Spain has become vacant, and it is expedient that the jurisdiction given by the Ordinance No. 16 of 1851, entitled "An Ordinance for the establishing of Petty Civil Courts," shall vest in His Honour Horace FitzGerald, the first Puisne Judge of the Supreme Civil Court of this Island: Be it enacted by His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council, as follows:—

1. This Ordinance shall be read and construed as one with the said Ordinance Number 16 of 1851.

2. All jurisdiction, powers and duties attached to the office of Commissioner of the Petty Civil Court of Port-of-Spain by the said Ordinance are hereby vested in and shall henceforth be executed by the said Horace FitzGerald as Judge of the Petty Civil Court of Port-of-Spain to the same extent and in the same manner as if he had been appointed the Commissioner of the said Petty Civil Court of Port-of-Spain under and by virtue of the said Ordinance.

3. It shall be lawful for the said Horace FitzGerald during his tenure of office as Judge of the Petty Civil Court to appoint some fit and proper person or persons to be a clerk or clerks to him as such judge and such person or persons from time to time to remove as he shall see fit.

4. It shall be lawful for the said Horace FitzGerald from time to time to make rules to alter and regulate the practice and procedure of the said Petty Civil Court, and also to hold the said Court instead of Saturday on any other day in the week save and except Sunday and public holidays.

5. It shall be lawful for the Governor from time to time to appoint a deputy to discharge the duties of the said Horace FitzGerald as Judge of the Petty Civil Court in case of his illness or his absence from this Island.

6. The said Horace FitzGerald and every deputy so appointed as aforesaid shall take the following oath before the Governor: I, A. B., do swear that I will faithfully, impartially and honestly, according to the best of my abilities, execute all the powers and duties committed to me by virtue of the Ordinance, entitled "An Ordinance with respect to the Petty Civil Court in Port-of-Spain."

Passed in Council this first day of August, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four.
