

woman whether made before or after her marriage upon the receipt of such woman which, notwithstanding her coverture, shall be a sufficient discharge without the concurrence of her husband, except in respect of any deposit as to which her husband before such payment proves in the prescribed manner that the same was made after the marriage with his money, and requires that payment be not made otherwise than as he directs.

AN ORDINANCE for the regulation of The Queen's Park.

(L.S.) S. FREELING, *Governor.*

5th December, 1882.

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council, as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as "The Queen's Park Short title.
"Regulation Ordinance, 1882."

2. It shall be lawful for the Governor from time to time to make, alter and revoke regulations as to the use Power to make regulations. by the public of the Queen's Park, as to the times during which and the conditions under which persons, horses and carriages, cattle and other animals may be admitted to the said Park.

Any such regulation may impose a penalty not exceeding Five Pounds in respect of any breach thereof.

Every person offending against any such regulation shall be guilty of an offence punishable on summary conviction, and liable to such penalty as is provided by the regulation, or, if no penalty is so provided, to any penalty not exceeding Forty Shillings.

Power to
arrest without
warrant.

3. It shall be lawful for any police constable or any other person appointed by the Governor in this behalf to arrest without warrant any person who within his view commits any breach of any regulation made under this Ordinance, if the name and address of such person is unknown to such constable, or if such person continues to commit such breach after being warned to desist, and to detain him in custody until he can be conveniently brought before a Justice of the Peace to be dealt with according to law.

Publication of
regulations.

4. All regulations made under this Ordinance shall be published in the *Royal Gazette*. Production of a copy of the *Royal Gazette* purporting to contain any such regulation shall be *prima facie* evidence of the due making and tenor of such regulation.

Saving.

5. Nothing in this Ordinance shall prejudice or in any manner affect

1. The Ordinance No. 33 of 1855, intituled "An Ordinance for the regulation of Races in the Queen's Park."
2. Any right, power, estate, title or interest of Her Majesty, Her Heirs or Successors, or of the Governor in right of Her Majesty, Her Heirs or Successors, or
3. Any private right of Sepulture or of way, or any other private right in, to, over or upon the said Queen's Park or any part thereof.
