AN ORDINANCE to Vest the Rights and Liabilities of the dissolved West India and Panama Telegraph Company, Limited, in a New Company of the same name.

WHEREAS a certain company named "The West India and Panama Telegraph Company, Limited," (hereinafter called the Old Company), was on the 30th of July, 1869, incorporated according to the Laws of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and has since been dissolved.

And whereas a certain other company (hereinafter called the New Company), named "The West India and Panama Telegraph Company, Limited," was on the 9th of January, 1877, incorporated according to the Laws of the said United Kingdom.

And whereas the New Company has made application that all the rights, powers, privileges, obligations and liabilities of the Old Company should be transferred to, vested in, and imposed upon the New Company; and it is expedient that such application should be complied with: Therefore may it please your Excellency to enact and be it enacted by His Excellency the Governor with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as “The West India and Panama Telegraph Company (Limited), Ordinance, 1879.” Short title.

2. All the rights, powers, privileges, obligations and liabilities which, under or by virtue of “The West India and Panama Telegraph Company, Limited, Ordinance, 1871,” or under or by virtue of the Ordinance No. 1 of 1872, intituled “An Ordinance for vesting certain powers in the West India and Panama Telegraph Company, Limited,” or under or by virtue of any other Ordinance or Law, were at the time of the dissolution of the Old Company, vested in or imposed upon the Old Company, are hereby transferred to, vested in and imposed upon the New Company. Transfer of rights, &c. of old company to new company.

3. Save always to the Queen’s Most Excellent Majesty, her heirs and successors, and to all bodies politic and corporate and to all other persons whatsoever, except the Old Company and the New Company, and all persons having any share or interest in either of the said Companies, and all creditors or other persons having any claim or demand against either of the said Companies, all such powers, privileges, rights and remedies as they respectively would have if this Ordinance had never been passed. Saving.
