AN ORDINANCE to vest in Her Majesty the Queen
the San Fernando Tramroad.

(L.S.) HENRY T. IRVING.

12th December, 1878.

WHEREAS the Council of the Borough of San Fernando in exercise of the power given by the Ordinance No. 10 of 1864, intituled "An Ordinance to empower the Mayor and Burgesses of the Borough of San Fernando to lay down a Tramroad from the Ciperó Tramroad to the San Fernando Wharf," has laid down such tramroad with a branch thereto:

And whereas the said Mayor and Burgesses of San Fernando are desirous of surrendering the said tramroad, and are indebted to Her Majesty the Queen in divers sums of money: Be it enacted by his Excellency

the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council as follows :

1. The said tramroad and branch tramroad, and all Vests tramroad in Her Majesty. trucks, plant, stock and appurtenances whatsoever, and all lands set out and taken or otherwise acquired by the said Mayor and Burgesses under the authority of the said recited Ordinance and the Ordinance No. 11 of 1868, and which now remain vested in the said Mayor and Burgesses are hereby vested in Her Majesty the Queen.

2. The Governor in his Executive Council shall from Power to Governor to fix tolls. time to time appoint the fares and tolls which shall be paid for all passengers and goods carried upon or by the said tramroad, and a table of such fares and tolls shall be placed and left in some open and conspicuous place at each terminus of the said tramroad.

3. The several wharf dues specified in Schedule G of Wharf dues leviable under Ordinance 10 of 1853 to be paid to Receiver-General. Ordinance No. 10 of 1853, intituled " An Ordinance for the regulation of Municipal Corporations in this Island " shall henceforth be paid to the Receiver-General and shall be by him carried to the credit of the general revenue of the Colony.

4. The Ordinances specified in the Schedule to this Repeal. Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent in the third column of that Schedule mentioned : Provided that this repeal shall not apply to or affect any offence committed or penalty incurred under the Ordinance No. 3 of 1874, before the commencement of this Ordinance.

AN ORDINANCE to Vest the Rights and Liabilities of the dissolved West India and Panama Telegraph Company, Limited, in a New Company of the same name.

WHEREAS a certain company named "The West India and Panama Telegraph Company, Limited," (hereinafter called the Old Company), was on the 30th of July, 1869, incorporated according to the Laws of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and has since been dissolved.

And whereas a certain other company (hereinafter called the New Company), named "The West India and Panama Telegraph Company, Limited," was on the 9th of January, 1877, incorporated according to the Laws of the said United Kingdom.
