AN ORDINANCE to place the Revenue and Expenditure of the Ward Unions on the General Estimates of the Colony.

(L.S.) HENRY T. IRVING.

4th November, 1878.

WHEREAS it is expedient that all moneys received on account of the several ward unions or wards be carried to the general revenue of the Island, and that certain portions of such moneys be made applicable in manner hereinafter expressed: Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council, as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited for all purposes as Short title. the "Ward Revenue Ordinance 1878."

2. All sums of money received by any Commissioner, Warden, or Assistant Warden by virtue of any Ordinance for the uses of any ward union or ward or otherwise in respect thereof, shall forthwith be paid to the Receiver General and be carried by him to the general revenue of the Island.

Section 3 is repealed by Ordinance No. 22 of 1879.

WHEREAS the Council of the Borough of San Fernando in exercise of the power given by the Ordinance No. 10 of 1864, intituled "An Ordinance to empower the Mayor and Burgesses of the Borough of San Fernando to lay down a Tramroad from the Ciperó Tramroad to the San Fernando Wharf," has laid down such tramroad with a branch thereto:
