AN ORDINANCE to make provision as to the Signature of Negotiable Instruments in certain cases.

(L. S.) HENRY T. IRVING.

1st August, 1879.

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council, as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as "The Negotiable Instruments Ordinance, 1879." Short title.

2. Where any person, signing in characters which are not European or by a mark, signs a bill of exchange for a sum not exceeding ten pounds as drawer, acceptor or indorser, or signs a promissory note for a sum not exceeding ten pounds as maker or indorser, such signature shall have no effect whatever unless it is made in the presence of and attested by the Protector, Sub-Protector or any Inspector of Immigrants, a Commissioner of a Province, Justice of the Peace, Clerk of the Peace,

Signature of bills of exchange and notes in characters not European.

Warden, Assistant Warden, Minister of Religion, Government Medical Officer, Commissioned or Non-Commissioned Officer of Police, or by a person being or acting as the proprietor or manager of an estate employing indentured immigrants.

Duty of
attestor.

3. Any one attesting a signature under this Ordinance shall first satisfy himself as to the identity of the party signing, and ascertain that such party understands the nature and effect of the instrument which he signs.

AN ORDINANCE for further extending the Railway to San Fernando.

(L. S.) HENRY T. IRVING.

4th September, 1879.

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council, as follows :—

Short title.

1. This Ordinance may be cited for all purposes as "The Trinidad Extension Railway Ordinance, 1879."

Power to
establish
railway.

2. It shall be lawful for the Governor to establish and maintain a railway, with terminal and intermediate stations and all proper works and conveniences for the conveyance of passengers and goods, commencing at the Exchange Village in the Ward of Couva, and terminating at the San Fernando Wharf, according to the plan of such intended railway made by Mr. J. Edward Tanner in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine,
