AN ORDINANCE for the Interpretation of an Ordinance entitled "An Ordinance for regulating the execution of Deeds and the Proof, registration and admission in evidence of Deeds and Wills.

**W**HEREAS an Ordinance was passed in Council on the first day of April, in the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty-two, entitled "An Ordinance for regulating the execution of Deeds, and the Proof, registration and admission in evidence of Deeds and Wills:" Be it enacted and declared by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council, as follows :

Preamble cites Ordinance No. 5 of 1862.

1. The words "Mayor of any City Town or Borough in Great Britain or Ireland," in the Clause marked 9 of the said Ordinance, and the word "Mayor" in the Clauses marked respectively 10 and 23 of the said Ordinance shall extend to and include the Chief Magistrate and the Deputy Mayor of any City Town or Borough in the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland or in any British Colony, Possession, or Dependency, and any Magistrate acting in the name and on the behalf of any such Mayor or Chief Magistrate.

The word "Mayor" in the cited ordinance to include chief magistrates and deputy mayors of cities, towns, &c.

2. The present Ordinance shall be read with and construed as part of the said recited Ordinance of the first day of April aforesaid.
