

of any such offence before a Stipendiary Justice be imprisoned with or without hard labour for any period not exceeding three calendar months.

6. Every person adjudged a suspected person under this Ordinance shall during the term for which he shall be subject to the supervision of the police, be deemed an habitual criminal within the meaning of the Ordinance entitled "The Habitual Criminals Ordinance, 1870," and if guilty of any of the offences mentioned in the clause marked 8 of the said Ordinance, shall, and may be dealt with and punished under the provisions of the said Ordinance.

Suspected person to be deemed an habitual criminal.

AN ORDINANCE for the appointment of a Colonial Store Keeper.

[L. S.] ARTHUR GORDON.

April 28th, 1870.

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council, as follows:—

1. It shall be lawful for Her Majesty to appoint from time to time such person as she may see fit to be Colonial Store Keeper; and every person so appointed shall hold office at the pleasure of Her Majesty.

Appointment of Colonial Store Keeper to be vested in the Queen.

2. On the first appointment of a Colonial Store Keeper under this Ordinance, the office of Master of the

Colonial Store Keeper to perform the

duties heretofore performed by Master of Colonial Hospital.

Colonial Hospital shall cease and determine, and the duties heretofore performed by such Master shall be performed by such Colonial Store Keeper.

Salary, &c., to be allowed.

3. There shall be paid to every such Colonial Store Keeper, during his tenure of office, from the Colonial Treasury, a salary at the rate of four hundred and fifty pounds per annum exclusive of the travelling expenses for visiting any establishment beyond five miles from the town of Port of Spain, to be allowed from time to time by the Auditor-General.

Colonial Store Keeper to be charged with the purchase and issue of stores, &c., for the several Government establishments.

4. The Colonial Store Keeper shall be charged with the purchase and issue of all stores, provisions, medicines, and other articles which may from time to time be required for the use of the several departments herein-after mentioned, that is to say "the Colonial Hospitals," "the Royal Gaols," "the Leper Asylum," "the Lunatic Asylum," and "the House of Refuge," and of any other department which the Governor may from time to time appoint.

Power to Governor to make rules for defining duties of Store Keeper. Rules to be laid before Council.

5. It shall be lawful for the Governor from time to time to make such rules and regulations as he shall see fit for defining the duties of such Colonial Store Keeper; and a copy of such rules and regulations shall from time to time be laid before the Legislative Council.

Passed in Council this twenty-sixth day of April, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy.
