AN ORDINANCE for the Appointment of District
Medical Officers.

7th July, 1870.

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council, as follows:

1. It shall be lawful for the Governor from time to time to appoint such persons as he shall see fit (being members of the Medical Board of the Island), to be district medical officers under this Ordinance.

2. The Governor shall assign to each of such medical officers a district to comprise such parts of the Island as the Governor may see fit, and every such district medical officer shall hold office during the pleasure of the Governor.

3. Every district medical officer shall, during his tenure of office, be a coroner, and also the district vaccinator and sanitary inspector for the several parts of the Island comprised in his district.

4. Every such district medical officer shall be entitled to such fees on every inquest taken by him as are allowed to coroners by the Ordinance No. 8, of 1868, entitled "An Ordinance for the Appointment of Coroners," and to such fees for attendance and successful vaccination as are allowed to district vaccinators under the Ordinance No. 7, of 1869, entitled "An Ordinance to amend and consolidate the law with regard to the Practice of Vaccination."

Passed in Council this first day of July, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy.
