

imprisoned in the Royal Gaol or at the police-station of the police office at which he shall have been convicted.

Offenders sentenced to hard labour may be worked as the governor shall direct.

3. Any person sentenced on summary conviction to imprisonment with hard labour may be worked on the public roads, or in such other manner as the Governor may from time to time direct.

Offenders imprisoned in the gaol on summary convictions for more than fourteen days may be removed to a penal establishment.

4. It shall be lawful for the Governor by warrant under his hand to make order for the removal to any penal establishment, to be licensed by the Governor, of any person to be named in such order who may be imprisoned in the Royal Gaol under the conviction of any Justice of the Peace for any term exceeding fourteen days; And any person so removed shall be imprisoned, and if sentenced to hard labour shall labour at such penal establishment for the residue of his term of imprisonment.

AN ORDINANCE for the Prevention of Nuisance within the Town of Port of Spain from Waters holding Soap in Solution.

(L. S.) ARTHUR GORDON.

WHEREAS the practice which prevails of throwing waters used in the washing of clothes and holding soap in solution into the open yards of the town is injurious to the public health, and it is expedient to prohibit the same: Be it enacted by his Excellency the Governor with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council as follows:

1. The owner of every tenement within the Town of Port of Spain or the suburbs thereof in which any water holding soap in solution shall be thrown into or upon any yard or uncovered land, or shall escape or drain except into some covered cesspool or into the service sewer pipe of such tenement or some pipe or paved drain or gutter leading into such cesspool or service sewer pipe shall be guilty of an offence under this Ordinance, and shall on conviction thereof forfeit and pay for the first offence such sum not exceeding twenty shillings, and for the second and every subsequent offence such sum not exceeding five pounds as to the convicting justice shall seem fit.

Where soapwater shall be thrown into a yard, or shall escape except into a sewer or cesspool, the owner shall be liable to a penalty.

2. For the better detection of offences against this Ordinance it shall be lawful for any Superintending Inspector or Sanitary Inspector or any person acting under the authority in writing of such Sanitary Inspector at any time between the hours of six o'clock in the morning and six o'clock in the afternoon of any day to enter any tenement within the town of Port of Spain or the suburbs thereof, and inspect the state or condition of such tenement, and the pipes, drains and gutters thereof.

Superintending and sanitary inspectors or persons authorised by them may inspect tenements, &c.

3. Every penalty imposed by this Ordinance may be recovered before any Justice of the Peace having jurisdiction within the town of Port of Spain, on the information of the Sanitary Inspector; and no fees shall be payable upon or in respect of any such information; and all penalties shall be paid over to the Local Board of Health of the borough of Port of Spain.

Penalties may be recovered summarily, and to be paid to Local Board of Health.

4. Within the meaning and for the purposes of this Ordinance the word "tenement" shall extend to and include any yard whether open or enclosed, and the word "owner" shall extend to and include every person in the occupation of the whole or any part of any tenement.

Interpretation of terms.

Passed in Council this first day of October, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven.
