AN ORDINANCE to provide for the extinguishment
of a certain right of way.

WHEREAS it is expedient to provide in the interest
of the Public for the extinguishment of the right
of way heretofore existing along that part of the street
heretofore known as Prince Street and now covered by
the improvements and extensions of the Government
Buildings facing Brunswick Square.

Be it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and
Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative
Council thereof as follows:—

1. The right of the public to pass and repass through
and along the ground formerly part of Prince Street in

the Borough of Port-of-Spain between Brunswick Square and St. Vincent Street shall be and the same is hereby extinguished.

2. The Governor may by order authorize the closing of the gates to the centre of the said Government Buildings between Brunswick Square and St. Vincent Street aforesaid on such days and at such hours as he shall from time to time deem expedient.

Passed in Council this Third day of October, in the year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight.
