AN ORDINANCE to provide for the regulation of
Hackney Carriages in proclaimed districts.

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and
Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legis-
lative Council thereof as follows:—

Short title.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as "The Hackney
Carriage Ordinance, 1900."

Proclamation.

2. It shall be lawful for the Governor by Proclama-
tion under his hand and the Seal of the Colony to
extend the provisions of "The Hackney Carriage Ordi-
nance, 1877," to any specified district in the Colony.

3. In every such proclamation the Governor shall
declare by whom the powers vested in and the duties
imposed upon any officer mentioned in "The Hackney
Carriage Ordinance, 1877," shall be performed in respect
of any such proclaimed district; and the Governor may
alter as regards the district proclaimed the amounts

payable under the said Ordinance as license duties and as rates and fares as to him shall seem fit.

4. Any proclamation issued under the provisions hereof shall be published in the *Royal Gazette* and shall come into force on a day to be named in such proclamation. ^{Publication.}

5. Production of the *Royal Gazette* containing a copy of any proclamation purporting to be made under this Ordinance shall be *prima facie* evidence in any Court in the Colony of the making and provisions of such proclamation. ^{Evidence.}
