AN ORDINANCE to amend the Harbour Dues Ordinances, 1896 and 1898.

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows :—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as "The Harbour Dues Ordinance, 1900," and shall be read as one with "The Harbour Dues Ordinances, 1896 and 1898," and may be cited therewith as "The Harbour Dues Ordinances, 1896—1900."

2. The following proviso shall be read as part of Section 2 of "The Harbour Dues Ordinance, 1898," to be inserted after the words "the satisfaction of the Collector of Customs;" that is to say :—

Provided that where dues have been charged as payable in respect of any goods transhipped from a ship to another ship in the same

harbour whether directly or by lighters, dues on the shipping of such goods shall not be charged to the ship on to which the same goods shall have been transferred, unless such goods shall have been landed between the discharge and reloading or transfer of the same.
