AN ORDINANCE to amend “The Fire Brigade Ordinance, 1894.” (14—1894.)

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may for all purposes be cited as Short title.
“The Fire Brigade Amendment Ordinance, 1895.”

This Ordinance and “The Fire Brigade Ordinance, Construction. 1894,” hereinafter called the Principal Ordinance, may together be cited as “The Fire Brigade Ordinances, 1894, and 1895.”

2. Section 8 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby Repeal Section 2 of Principal Ordinance. repealed, and instead thereof shall be read the following:—

8. A sum not exceeding one-sixth of the total expenditure incurred in carrying the provisions of this Ordinance into effect shall by way of contribution be borne and paid in equal proportions by the Agents of all Insurance Companies carrying on or doing any business in the Colony.

Governor, may authorize commutation.

The Governor may, if he shall think fit, order the commutation of such contribution or sum of one-sixth of the total expenditure by an annual payment of Twenty Pounds by the Agent of each Insurance Company carrying on or doing business within the Colony, or by the payment of such other sum by way of commutation as the Governor may prescribe.

When contribution or commutation due.

The contribution of one-sixth of the total expenditure, or any commutation thereof, ordered by the Governor under the authority of this Ordinance, shall be due and payable by the Agents of each Insurance Company as aforesaid on or before the 15th day of January in each and every year.

Publication of notice.

Whenever the Governor shall order the payment of any sum by way of commutation notice of such order shall be published in the *Royal Gazette*.

The publication of such notice in the *Royal Gazette* shall be deemed to be sufficient notice to the Agents of Insurance Companies of such commutation, and of the sum payable in respect thereof.

Repeal Section 21 of Principal Ordinance

3. Section 21 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby repealed.

Repeal not to effect past proceedings.

4. The repeal by this Ordinance shall not affect the validity or invalidity, or any operation, effect or consequence of any instrument executed or made, or anything

done or suffered before the commencement of this Ordinance, or any proceeding or thing pending or uncompleted, and every proceeding and thing may be carried on and completed as if there had been no such repeal as contained in this Ordinance.
