AN ORDINANCE to amend "The Dry River Ordinance, 1893." (29—1893.)

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may for all purposes be cited as Short title.
"The Dry River Ordinance, 1895."

It shall be read and construed as one with "The Construction.
Dry River Ordinance, 1893," hereinafter called the
Principal Ordinance.

The Principal Ordinance and this Ordinance may together for all purposes be cited as "The Dry River Ordinances, 1893 and 1895."

Repeal.

2. Section 8 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby repealed, and instead thereof shall be read the following:—

8. In every case where compensation shall be allowed to any person or Corporation for or in respect of any land taken for the purposes of this Ordinance, the Court, Judge, or Arbitrators before whom any case in respect of such compensation shall be tried or heard, shall,

(a) whenever any benefit shall or may be derived by the person whose lands shall have been taken by reason of any works or repairs executed under this Ordinance whether in, upon, or in the neighbourhood of the lands so taken; or

(b) whenever the land or property of any person or Corporation taken under this Ordinance shall or may be increased in value by reason of any such works or repairs as aforesaid executed in, upon, or in the neighbourhood of the land so taken,

deduct from and set off against the amount of compensation which would otherwise be awarded to any such person or Corporation the value of the benefit which shall or may be derived by such person or Corporation or the amount by which the value of such land or property shall or may be increased by reason of such works or repairs.

Proviso.

3. The repeal by this Ordinance shall not affect the validity or invalidity of anything done or suffered, or

any right accrued or liability incurred before the commencement of this Ordinance, or any proceeding pending or uncompleted at the commencement of this Ordinance.
