AN ORDINANCE to extend the provisions of the Volunteer Ordinances of 1879, 1880, and 1891.

**B**E it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows :—

1. This Ordinance shall be construed as one with Construction. Ordinances No. 6 of 1879, No. 5 of 1880, and No. 16 of 1891 ; and the said Ordinances, together, may be cited for all purposes as “The Volunteer Ordinances, 1879, “ 1880, 1891, and 1895.”

2. It shall be lawful for the Governor, on behalf of Her Majesty, to accept the services of any persons Yeomanry Cavalry—services of persons to be accepted. desirous of being enrolled as Yeomanry Cavalrymen in the Trinidad Local Forces ; and such persons, when called up for training in barracks, and when on the

march to and from such training, (as well as when called out for Active Service) shall be subject to the provisions of the Army Act.

3. When any portion of any part of the Local Forces is voluntarily assembled for training in Camp or in Barracks, such portion of the said Local Forces shall be subject to the provisions of the Army Act.
